News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have had to write an apology letter. It seems that all the problems in our playground were Goldilocks' fault, so we had to help her say sorry to the Three Bears. We also fixed Baby Bear's chair and helped to tidy the cottage. We have been counting and adding using a number-line and we have even started counting in 2s.

We have made dough bears, and we have met a very old teddy bear and learnt about some of the differences between old and new teddies.

Some of the children made a lovely wooden brick tower for our class bears to live in, but after a few days, disaster struck and their tower fell down. Luckily no bears were hurt, but since then there have been lots of messages from them and a new home has been started.

And finally.... everyone was delighted when our beautiful new "bug carpet" arrived. Everyone has a space on the carpet and we would like to send a MASSIVE thank you to FOLS for funding this for us.

Year One

A big well done to the children for a super assembly!

This week has been a very busy one. On Tuesday we had an interesting visit from The Hearing Dogs for Deaf People. We met a lovely hearing dog called Cooper and his trainer Claire who showed us how she has trained him so that he is ready to help his new owner. Judith and Sue showed us video clips and talked to us about the brilliant work that hearing dogs do. We learnt a lot! We also thought of some super questions to ask them.

After the visit we wrote a recount and thank you letters.

Our focus for Maths this week has been 10 more and 10 less. We have been counting in multiples of 10 and we can tell you how we know if a number is a multiple of 10 or not! We have also been identifying which multiple of 10 is missing in a sequence.

We also had a very exciting afternoon on Thursday working with the Chiltern Rangers. <u>www.phonicsplay</u> (focus on phase 4 and 5)

Year Two

In Year 2 we have been enjoying the story of 'Room on the Broom' by Julia Donaldson. We have sequenced the events of the story in chronological order, completed a character description of the dragon, written a recount from the dragon's point of view and a thank you letter from the witch. We have designed a new broomstick for the witch and written instructions for the spell. In Maths, we have been leaning to read and draw the time in five minute intervals e.g. 10 past 3, 20 to 9 etc. We have also been sequencing time and calculating times that are earlier and later e.g. 1 hour earlier than 2 o'clock, 15 minutes later than half past 4 etc. This has proved to be a bit trickier and extra practise at home would be beneficial. In Phonics, we have been learning to read and write homophones (words that have the same sound but a different spelling and meaning) e.g. to, too and two. Examples of these can be found on the spelling sheets on the class page of the website. In Topic, we have been continuing our learning of big habitats and have completed a collage of our chosen habitats, adding animals and plants to a painted background. Year Three

This week in English, we have been looking at a new text called 'Wolves in the Walls' by Neil Gaiman. We have talked about the blurb and what the story might be about. Towards the end of the week we predicted the events by writing storyboards and thinking about the structure of the story to help us.

In Maths we have been looking at Multiplication and Division. To start the new unit we completed an engage and explore activity looking at this area of Maths in different ways. We looked at the commutative law along with doubling and halving numbers and applying such skills in different situations.

This week we have been preparing our class assembly. We have been talking about it and writing it in preparation for next week. We have also been learning how to code on hour of code (<u>learn.code.org</u>) and talking about the names and the animals in French. <u>https://studio.code.org/courses</u>

Year Four

In English this week, we have read the chapters about the golden ticket finders from 'Charlie and The Chocolate Factory'. We have used the text to infer what the characters are like and then used this to write character descriptions for Augustus Gloop and Verruca Salt.

In maths, we have continued our work on fractions. We have been adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers. We have also begun to look at finding fractions of amounts.

In our topic lessons this week, we have looked more carefully at the properties of solids, liquids and gases. We have also completed an investigation into melting and recording the temperature at which different solids melt when heated. On Thursday, we enjoyed our session with the Chiltern Rangers, which involved a number of outdoor activities including, digging, raking and planting!

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five has been continuing to read 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. We have explored the character of Tim, and drafted, written and edited diary entries recounting what he saw. We have also used drama to freeze frame what happened when the King's men arrived at the inn, and have begun to discover the fate of The Highwayman and Bess.

In maths, we have been converting fractions, decimals and percentages. We have been finding equivalences by changing fractions so that they have a denominator of one hundred and then converting them to a decimal and a percentage. We have also been reducing fractions into the simplest possible form.

In topic lessons, we have been testing our parachutes to find out how size, shape and material affect air resistance by timing how long each one takes to fall. We have also started a new PSHCE unit called A Mind to be Kind. We will focus on completing small acts of kindness and noticing how our actions can affect others around us.

Year Six

This week in Year 6, we have had a mock SATs week. In English we have continued reading the book 'Eye of the Wolf' written by Daniel Pennac. We have used our research on wolves to write non-chronological reports (information texts). We have published our writing into a book and placed it in the library for other children to read. In Maths we have been consolidating our understanding of fractions. We have multiplied fractions by whole numbers. In Topic, we have been exploring and describing how all organisms are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics, based on similarities and differences. On Friday we visited the Hazard Alley Safety Centre in Milton Keynes. We had a fantastic day experiencing all the different scenarios and learnt so much about how to keep ourselves safe.
