# Foundation Stage

This week Foundation Stage has opened a Post Office. They have written and posted letters, weighed parcels and heard a story about 'The Jolly Postman'. They have continued to practise their sound and numbers and have had their first PE lesson. www.phonicsplay.co.uk – great for phonics games – focus on phase 2 for now

# Year One

In English, Year 1 has been really enjoying 'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak. They have had fun writing about the mischief that Max made and finding adjectives to describe the wild things. They also had to sort out some mixed up sentences by making sure they started them with a capital letter and ended them with a full stop. In Maths, they have been busy measuring; they found things that were longer and shorter than our feet and then they used cubes to measure them. In Topic, they really enjoyed using stethoscopes to listen to their hearts before and after exercise. They have also been looking at similarities and differences between things that are living and not living. www.phonicsplay/phase3/picniconpluto

## Year Two

This week Year 2 has been continuing to write their information texts about The Great Fire of London. They have been focusing on the use of sentence openers, conjunctions and adjectives. In Phonics they are learning to use their knowledge of rules for adding the suffix –ed to spell past tense verbs. In Maths they have been learning to add single digit numbers to 2-digit numbers, and describe how the tens digit changes. This is an area that would benefit from further practise at home (see website below). In Topic they have been using The Great Fire of London as inspiration for writing a diary entry (just like Samuel Pepys) and a senses poem describing the fire.

## Year Three

In English his week Year 3 has been writing information pages about volcanoes. They used computers and other sources to find and use exciting facts to put in their own writing. They particularly liked the National Geographic 'Everything Volcanoes and Earthquakes' text for inspiration. In Maths, Year 3 has been learning how to use rounding when adding and subtracting numbers. They have also discussed and explored different ways of adding and subtracting numbers. They have also looked at bridging 10. In Topic, Year 3 has been looking at how to keep safe online. They have researched and found information about the volcano in Pompeii and what impact it had on people living in the vicinity. They also looked at the history and current status of the volcano

#### Year Four

Year 4 has enjoyed writing their Just So stories, concentrating on including speech, properly punctuated, varied adjectives and fronted adverbials. They have worked well in groups to practise, then act out, a few of the completed stories. In Maths, they have been practising their rounding skills to enable them to make useful estimates for addition and subtraction sums. They have built their shelters in the school grounds; we looked to see how many have survived and were pleased to see quite a few still standing and some even had some wildlife taking up residence (slugs, spiders, ants).

#### Year Five

This week Year 5 has been continuing to read 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. They have used drama to explore what Charlie should do with the money he found and have been writing newspaper articles about Charlie finding the golden ticket. Year 5 has now started to explore the character of Mr Willy Wonka. In Maths they have been continuing to practise mental and written methods for addition and subtraction with a focus on explaining which methods are the most efficient to use for different calculations.

During their Topic lessons, Year 5 has investigated carbonated drinks and the effects of mixing bicarbonate of soda with an acid. They have related this learning to the properties of materials and reversible and irreversible changes, and are applying their learning by exploring the different processes needed in making muffins!

## Year Six

In English, Year 6 has been investigating old English language to create a glossary. They have also written a letter to Jim Hawkin's mother describing his adventures in Bristol and on board The Hispanola. They have also written about what they would do if they won a million pounds, thinking about whether they would spend it wisely or foolishly. In Maths, they have been having their first lessons using algebra. They have also been using cuisenaire rods to create algebraic expressions such as a=c+3d or e=2f+2g. In Topic, they finished writing their tourist inspector report on The Rye. Year 6 enjoyed preparing and presenting to the rest of the school, and their parents, their first values assembly on trust. www.blueplanetbiomes.org/climate.htm
