News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation stage we have heard the story of the 'Gingerbread Man'. We have role played the story and written out speech for the Gingerbread Man. We have also baked Gingerbread People and read and written the recipe. Year One

In English this week Year 1 have been busy writing instructions so that Miss Weston can make her own grass-head. We have also been putting instructions in the correct order. Year 1 have really enjoyed learning about split digraphs this week....ask them what they have learnt!

This week, in maths, has been a busy money week! Year 1 have been identifying and ordering all of the coins up to $\pounds 2$. We have also been sorting them according to their colour and properties. We may well ask you if we can empty purses and wallets out to count your coins! We have been adding coins to find the total amount of money in each purse. In topic this week we discussed the results of our growing investigation. We now know that plants definitely need water and light to grow!

Year Two

In English, Year 2 has been enjoying the Film Text 'Bubbles'. We have written a letter as the girl character telling her Auntie about her adventures. Also, we have planned and written our own version of the story. In Maths, we have been continuing to develop our addition skills by using partitioning to add 2-digit numbers. In Topic, we have been using world maps to investigate which countries some fruits and vegetables came from, and we have been sorting foods into healthy and not healthy using French names for the foods. Year Three

This week has been a fun and exciting one for Year 3. In Maths, we started off our week with learning more about fractions! We have learned that fractions (like halves and quarters) are dealing with the smaller numbers between two whole numbers. For instance, if we had a pizza, and had four people, we would have to split the pizza up into quarters! Each person would get one quarter of the pizza! In English, we have been hard at work on our assessed piece of writing. We have planned, written, edited, and then rewrote a wonderful alternate ending to the book 'Storm'!

Finally, I want to say congratulations to Year 3 on an AMAZING performance in their values assembly! A lot of teachers and parents have complimented you! Year Four

During our English lessons this week, we have read the next chapter in our current book 'The Firework Maker's Daughter'. During this chapter, one of the characters, Chulak, attended an event and we have been writing diary entries as a character who witnessed the event. We have been working on using a range of sentence openers and varying our sentence lengths to add impact to our writing.

During our Maths lessons we have been learning about bar models and bar charts. We have used these to find sums and differences between data that has been presented in the bar charts. We have also collected our own data, presented this in a bar chart and asked questions of the data before finding further sums and differences.

During topic we have continued our investigation work into the properties of liquids, solids and gases. On Monday, we experimented with turning milk into a solid by adding vinegar and food dye. We had to mix the vinegar into full fat milk, stir for a few minutes before pouring through a sieve to separate the solid from the liquid. Definitely an experiment to try and home!

Year Five

This week in English Year Five has used slow writing to describe what Ayesha's journey through No Man's Land would have been like. We have also written interviews with Doctor Leila and have begun planning newspaper reports which we will write next week. In Maths, Year Five has continued working on fractions and decimals. We have simplified

fractions, solved problems and compared fractions with different denominators. We have also been converting between improper fractions and mixed numbers.

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Year Six

This week in Year 6, it has been Assessment Week. We have completed assessments in Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling and Maths. The results of these assessments will be shared with parents at next week's Parent Teacher Consultation Appointments. In English this week, we have written a short narrative from our work on 'The Eye of the Storm'. We have written the story as the mysterious pilot flies into the eye, what happens in the eye and finally what lies on the other side of the eye. In Maths we have been consolidating our learning on algebra. In Topic we have been exploring the Mayan calendar and have written the date and our birthday in ancient Mayan. We have also been learning about Mayan writing. The Mayan used a system of glyphs in their writing and we have drawn and painted our own names.
