News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

This week we read the story "We're going on a bear hunt". We know the story very well now and so we decided we should go on a bear hunt of our own. We put on our wellies and went exploring and eventually we found a bear cave in our playground. We tiptoed in with torches and found... A BEAR!

We have also been learning about real bears and so far we haven't found a real bear that likes porridge. They seem to prefer fish, meat, nuts and berries. We have all been writing what we know about real bears.

We have been looking at clocks and learning to tell the time. We can all do o'clock so now it's time to have a go at half pasts.

Year One

This week we have been focussing on poetry in our English lessons. We have been enjoying poetry about the senses. We have looked at some of the features of a poem including verses and rhyme, although we do know that not all poems rhyme! We have

been working hard to identify words that rhyme. We really enjoyed writing an acrostic poem about the sense of taste.

In Maths we have been working on multiples of 2. We now know that a multiple of 2 is an even number! We have been sorting numbers into multiples of 2 and not multiples of 2. We have also been adding and subtracting 2 and solving worded problems. In topic we really enjoyed looking at pictures of the badger and the fox that our new night camera has recorded (see below). We found out some interesting facts about these animals. We also looked at how our beanstalks are changing and have sequenced the lifecycle of a bean.

Year Two

This week, in English, we have begun to read 'The Diary of a Killer Cat' by Anne Fine. We looked at the book cover and made predictions about the events, characters and setting by using clues from the cover. Then we wrote a character description of Tuffy, collecting effective vocabulary and using evidence from the text to explain our choices. We also wrote our own version of Chapter 3 written from the point of view of Tuffy's owner. Then we created our own chapter for the book based on the style used by Anne Fine and, finally, we wrote a letter of apology from Tuffy to his owners. In Phonics we have been continuing to learn about homophones by defining them and using them correctly within sentences. In Maths we have continued to learn how to sequence intervals of time and to add or take away times when solving problems e.g. The Queen left the palace at 9 o'clock. She walked for 30 minutes. What time did she get back to the palace? Lots of practise of these types of questions in real life would be useful to practise at home e.g. If I put the cake in the oven at half past 10 and it takes 20 minutes to bake, what time will it be ready? In Topic we have been learning about the French artist Henri Rousseau. We have studied two of his paintings, made comparisons and expressed an opinion about each one. We then created our own interpretation of one of the paintings using pastels.

Year Three

This week in English the children have been continuing with the story, 'Wolves in the Walls' by Neil Gaiman. To start the week we completed some imaginative writing before moving onto discussing and empathising with the different characters in the book through hot seating. Towards the end of the week, we wrote diary entries as Lucy, concentrating on full sentences with conjunctions and paragraphs.

In Maths, we looked at multiplying a two digit number by a single digit number. We compared multiplication and division statements using inequality brackets to help us. We then moved onto using our known multiplication facts to help solve others. For example, we knew that 4x8=32, therefore 40x8=320. We used arrays to help us multiply these numbers. Next week we will be moving onto the grid method for multiplying. We have been busy preparing our class assembly in most afternoons this week. We have been talking in front of an audience and singing too. When we haven't been practising our assembly we have been drawing self-portraits in the style of Julian Opie. We have taken photographs in order to trace the outlines of our faces and include simple facial features. After, we used vibrant colours for maximum effect. https://tothotornot.com/julian-opie/

Year Four

In English this week Year 4 have continued to read 'Charlie and The Chocolate Factory'. We have read 'The Miracle' chapter, in which Charlie was lucky enough to have found a fifty pence piece on the ground, bought a Wonka chocolate bar and discovered a golden ticket. We used the events to write a newspaper report about Charlie being the fifth and final golden ticket winner.

We have continued to look at fractions and decimals in maths. We have found fractions of amounts, first where the numerator is one and then later when the numerator is greater than one, which requires more steps to find the amount. We then looked at tenths and hundredths and have begun to look at how we can write and represent these as decimals.

During our topic lessons we have focused on changes in states of matter. We have looked at melting and what happens to the particles in a solid when they are heated. We carried out an investigation into melting and recorded the temperature of different frozen substances over time, as they melt. We have also researched the melting points of different metals and presented this information in a bar graph. https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/clips/zhtmhyc

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five have read to the end of the 'Highwayman' and we were shocked to discover what happened! We have planned, drafted and edited our own alternative endings to the story. To be successful in this, we had to carefully consider the audience and purpose of our writing, and think about the different clause structures we were using in our sentences.

In maths, we have started learning the formal written method for long multiplication. Alongside this, we have also been using the grid method for multiplying two and three digit numbers by two digit numbers by using related facts. We will then move on to using long multiplication to solve problems, and look at the formal written method for short division.

In topic lessons, we have continued with our PSHCE work on kindness, discussing different actions that people can take and whether these are kind or unkind. We have

also analysed the results off our parachute investigation and we have begun to make decisions about the material we will use for our parachutes, and started to design these. In geography, we have been locating different mountain ranges around the world and looking at the formation of Fold Mountains.

Year Six

In English this week we have been planning and writing letters to the pupils in Year 5 to tell them about our fantastic trip to Hazard Alley. We thought about the different scenarios that we experienced and which ones we enjoyed the most. As we were writing to someone in Year 5 we thought carefully about the level of informality that we would use. We hope that the Year 5 pupils will enjoy reading as they will visit Hazard Alley when they are in Year 6 next year. In Maths we have been calculating percentages of amounts, finding pairs of numbers that satisfy an equation with two unknowns, using the approximate equivalences between metric and common imperial units and solving problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages. In Topic we have been describing how plants and animals are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences. We have then created a branching classification diagram to sort different animals.

Please note that on Wednesday afternoon, we will be working with the Chiltern Rangers on Kingsmead. We will need to bring warm, waterproof clothes in and preferably wellington boots or old trainers.
