

Year One

We have had a very exciting week in Year 1 as we had a visit from Hunter the hearing dog. Year 1 wrote questions so that we could find out lots about hearing dogs. After the visit we wrote a recount of the visit and then made and wrote thank you cards. We made sure we wrote who the card was for and who it was from.

In maths this week we have been doing some more work on repeated addition. We had to work out the answers to repeated addition sums and then we wrote repeated addition sums to match a selection of pictures. We have also been solving problems which involve repeated addition.

In topic our focus this week has been on the sense of hearing. Year 1 learned about the problems that people can face when they can't hear. Hunter and the ladies from the hearing dogs for deaf taught us a lot about how a hearing dog can help a deaf person. We loved Hunter's visit!

Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been enjoying the story 'Stuck' by Oliver Jeffers. We have sequenced the events in the story, created our own story ending, written instructions for how to escape from the tree, created a diary entry as the milkman and a descriptive list poem about what was stuck in the tree. In Phonics, we have been learning about homophones, words that sound the same but are spelled differently and have different meanings e.g. there, their and they're. In Maths, we have been using sorting circles to help us to divide numbers into equal groups. We have used this method to help us to solve some division word problems. In Topic, we have been finding out about the micro-habitats found on our school grounds. We have explored what might live there and why this is a good home for its inhabitants. Year Three

This week in year 3 Mr. Neighbour has returned! It has been a week of change. In English, we have started a new book called The Legend of Spud Murphy. In Maths we have explored how we use fractions in everyday life. We worked very hard at the beginning of the week on our Class Assembly. Mr Courtney and Mr Neighbour were very proud of the fantastic assembly! On Friday we showed off our world book day costumes and everyone looked incredible! Year Four

During our English lessons we have continued to read the book Coraline. We have written a setting description using some of the writing skills that we have found in the book. Throughout the week we have also planned and written newspaper articles to report Coraline's parents going missing.

During Maths we have continued our work on fractions. We have found fractions of different quantities and we have also worked out how to find a quantity when given the fraction. Later in the week we have begun to look at tenths and hundredths and how to write these as decimals.

During topic this week we have planned and carried out an investigation into sound. Our aim was to find out who has the loudest scream in year 4. We had to consider how to carry out a fair test and how we were going to present our results.

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five have been using the figurative language techniques which we have been learning, to write descriptive narrative openings and poetry following the syllable pattern for 'The Dreadful Menace.' We have also been supporting each other to proof read and edit our work in order to make it more engaging for the reader. In maths, we have been revising fractions, decimals and percentages by finding different fractions and percentages of amount. We have used equivalences in order to do this, and have applied these skills to solve problems. We have now started to look at scaling numbers.

In topic lessons, we have created PowerPoint presentations to explain some of the reasons why the Roman Empire collapsed, and have been introduced to the Anglo Saxons. We have started looking at some of the Anglo Saxon treasures found at Sutton Hoo, and have discussed what this tells us about the invaders.

Year Six

This week in English we have been analysing writing to see how we can improve our own writing. We have finished and edited our letters to Year 5 about our trip to Hazard Alley. Finally we wrote the letters in neat and sent them to Year 5. Hopefully they have enjoyed reading them. We have also completed a Smart Write activity. We were able write in a genre of our choice about either Hazard Alley or about our current text 'Eye of the Wolf'. We had to write our own lesson objective and chose our own success criteria. In Maths we have continued to exploring fractions by converting improper fractions into mixed number fractions and vice versa. We have also found percentages of amounts and found pairs of numbers that satisfy an equation with two unknowns.

In Topic we have started our new unit 'Out of Africa' which is about evolution and adaptation. We have thought about what humans might look like in 10,000 years and how life started in the sea.
