News from the classes this week:

#### **Foundation Stage**

In Foundation Stage this week we have been listening to and writing about the story "Where the Wild Things are", which tells of a little boy who goes on an interesting journey. In maths we have been solving problems with addition, and our topic work has covered World Map work and planning our packing for different types of climates.

#### Year One

This week in English Year 1 has been really enjoying 'Aliens love underpants' by Claire Freedman and Ben Cort. We helped the author to complete her story by filling in missing words in sentences. We also had great fun designing their own aliens and then writing a character description using lots of amazing adjectives.

This week in Maths our focus has been on quarters. We identified shapes that had been divided into quarters and we also found a quarter of an amount of sweets. We then moved on to diving by 4. We have been very resourceful and resilient in our learning! In Topic we looked at clothes that we would wear in different seasons. We also thought about the type of clothes that we would wear if we lived near the equator or if we lived in the Arctic. We investigated some of the countries where our clothes were made. We had to look carefully at the information on the labels inside our clothes.

#### **Year Two**

This week Year 2 has been enjoying the story of 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. We have created a poster to help Penguin, written a recount as the boy and a letter from the boy to Penguin, as well as a list poem describing the items they packed in their suitcase! In Maths we have been recognising fractions and equivalent fractions. We have also learned how to scale up and down by multiplying and dividing by 2. In Topic we have thought about the positives and negatives of different transport types, and matched vehicles from other countries to their name and country of use. In Phonics we have revisited contractions, learning how to omit letters and add an apostrophe.

#### **Year Three**

In English this week, Year 3 has been continuing studying the book of 'Ottoline and the Yellow Cat.' We have been predicting the future events that may happen in the story and have written setting descriptions and postcards to Ottoline's mother and father. We have also started looking at the ways the author builds up suspense.

In Maths, Year 3 has started a new unit on shape, space and perimeter. We began the week by engaging and exploring this area of Maths in different contexts before naming, drawing, identifying and describing a variety of 3D shapes. Towards the end of the week, we looked at creating pictures using different shapes

In Topic this week, Year 3 has created wonderful Stone Age cave paintings using inspiration from our trip to Chiltern Open Air Museum and what we already understand about this period. We used charcoal to make it as realistic as they could. We have also written a description of a roundhouse, again, using inspiration from our school trip. We used adjectives to describe the inside and the outside as well as including lots of different senses in our writing.

#### **Year Four**

This week Year 4 has been planning, writing and then practising for their Values Assembly. The children were able to come up with some excellent ideas to demonstrate the value of Respect and all performed well. In maths we have been looking at scaling and at combinations. The children have measured the classroom and drawn a scale map of it as well as drawing scaled up versions of a picture. We explored finding out different combinations of choices from a menu; this proved a challenge to a lot of the class but we have persevered and are getting to grips with the ideas involved. In topic we have been finishing off our tourist leaflets for Ancient Egypt and then explored what a typical family from the time might have been like, what they may have worn, where they might live and what sort of jobs they could do.

#### **Year Five**

This week in English, Year Five has been continuing their work using the film clip The Piano and have been linking this to work on World War One and World War Two. We have read the poem Dulce et decorum est by Wilfred Owen, and written our own poetry in response to this. We have also written descriptive recounts of the scene from The Piano which is set in the war, and written letters home from the war to a loved one.

In maths, year five has been working hard to solve calculations using short division. We have then been expressing the remainders as either fractions or decimals and applied these skills to problem solving. Year five has shown great perseverance this week, in an area of maths which many of them find challenging. We are all proud of our hard work.

In topic, Year Five has been exploring the impact of surface area on air resistance. We have designed and created our costumes in order to see how air resistance affects the speed of a moving object, and we have started to test them and record our data. We will then analyse this and upload it to the BBC Terrific Scientific website.

#### **Year Six**

In English this week, Year 6 has been reading the book My Name is Mina by David Almond. We have been exploring Mina's character and have written character descriptions of her. We are also spending time rehearsing our leavers' production 'An Inspector Calls' and are looking forward to performing to the rest of the school and our parents at the end of term. In Maths, Year 6 has been continuing their theme park topic. We have now been able to use any profits made to invest in more land or buy extra rides and facilities. In Topic, Year 6 developed an understanding of the electrical symbols used in circuits.

#### **Music concert**

The concert will consist of performances from the school choir, Year 4, and some of the children learning an instrument. #### Lost property

We seem to have accumulated a great deal of lost property over the past months. We will start to display this during the next few weeks outside the front door – please ensure that you take a look to reclaim anything that your child may have lost.

#### **School funding**

As outlined in my letter a few months ago, all schools across Buckinghamshire are faced with a school funding crisis and tighter budgets. As a result of this the school has had to make some difficult financial decisions.

#### a) Breakfast Club

As some of you will know, the school breakfast club was set up a few years ago with some central funding. This enabled the school to offer low prices of £1.25 excluding breakfast and £2.50 including breakfast. Unfortunately the breakfast club funding was removed some time ago and as a result we have had to take the difficult decision to increase the charges with effect from 1st September 2017. The prices will be increasing to £2.50 excluding breakfast and £4.00 including breakfast from the Autumn term.

Also, due to recent demand, we will be expanding the opening times for breakfast club with an earlier start time of 7.45am (with effect from September 2017).

#### b) Pencil Cases

We took the decision some years ago to provide pencil cases with the required stationery items for all pupils. However, due to continued school budget pressures, we will be asking for a £4.50 annual donation from parents for this from September 2017.

As we move closer to the new school year, we wanted to let you know that as of this September we will send out the weekly newsletter by email only. In line with funding, this is in an effort to reduce down our costs whilst utilising the technology we have at our fingertips.
