Important Calendar Dates

The Morning 'Mile'

From Monday we are introducing a new way to start the school day. When the children come to school at 8.45am they will not be going straight to their classes but will participate in a walk, jog or run (their choice) for the first ten minutes. It is not meant that everyone will cover a mile in distance but that they will be active for the first ten minutes. Where similar initiatives have been introduced in other schools it has been noticed that when children start their learning they are more ready and able to settle quickly to their learning. Children should come to school in their uniforms as normal. If it is raining the children will go straight into their classrooms.

Key Stage 1 children should come into school as normal through the top gate, they will put book bags and any lunch boxes away and will go out onto their playground. Foundation Stage children will be included in this later on in the year.

Key Stage 2 children should come onto the playground where they will be shown where to leave their bags. The children may be on the field if the weather and the field is dry so they should wear trainers that they do not use for PE – they must bring their school shoes with them. If the field is wet they will be using the playaround.

News from the classes this week: **Foundation Stage**

In Foundation Stage this week we have been reading lots of stories together as a class and in small groups. We have been using the initial sounds that we have learnt, combined with clues from the pictures, to help us work out the words. The sounds that we have learnt this week are i, n, m and d. We have also learnt to recognise the words "the" and "a", and we've used a game about aliens to help us start to sound out and blend words. We have started the exciting journey towards reading, and the class adults are most impressed with our efforts. We have also been developing our number skills and have been counting to 20 (and beyond) and have been learning to recognise and write numbers. We had a number treasure hunt in the sandpit and this helped us to remember which number was which. We have also had our first PE lesson and all of us managed to get changed with only a little bit of help.

Year One

In English we have been busy learning even more about pets! We worked with a partner to sort animals into those that made good pets and those that didn't. We had some very good ideas about why some animals would not make a good pet! We worked really hard to make a leaflet to teach the Foundation Stage children how to take care of a pet. The best part was actually sharing our leaflets with them; they were very impressed!

In Maths our focus has been on subtracting. We have used cubes, pictures and a number line to help us to take one number away from another. We were concentrating on being accurate.

In topic we have been learning about the artist Picasso. This week we looked at some of his more abstract pictures. We created our own abstract rabbits. Miss Weston thought that they were even better than Picasso's!

We have also been learning about things that are living and those that have never been alive.

Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have spent our final week reading 'George's Marvellous Medicine' in English. We learned how to write command sentences, planned a recipe for a marvellous medicine, wrote and edited our recipes and published them to create a set of class recipe books. In Phonics we have revised the rules for adding suffixes to root words. We need lots of practising of these rules and the spelling lists on the VLE will support revision at home. In Maths we have been learning to order and compare numbers using the signs <, > and =. We have used these signs to compare number sentences e.g. 30 + 2 > 24 + 6. Practise of this at home would be helpful as some of us were guessing rather than calculating the totals! In Topic we have explored the story of The Great Fire of London through music and drama. We also had the opportunity to work with the Chiltern Rangers in our outdoor learning areas.

Year Three

In maths this week, we have been learning about rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 on a number line. We have also estimated answers by rounding. In English, we have created wanted posters for the Big Bad Wolf. We have also taken part in a healthy debate and located evidence from a text to write balanced arguments. In History, we have been building Roman Emperors and learning facts about their lives. We have begun to research different areas of Roman life ready to complete our projects. In Art, we have been learning about Roman mosaics. We have designed our own mosaics and are looking forward to creating them in our next lesson. In Science, we have continued our work on fossils by writing about how an organism turns into a fossil. In Computing, we have been exploring how to keep safe online. We have played a game called Mindful Mountain on the Interland website.

Year Four

In our English lessons this week, we have been writing non-chronological reports about a new creature that has been discovered in the Spiderwick House. We have used our imagination to think carefully about the characteristics of this creature, and written our reports using lots of descriptive phrases and vocabulary.

During our maths lessons, we have learnt how to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. First, we have found the multiples of 10, 100 or 1000 that the number comes between, then we have been using number lines to say whether to round up or down. We have also looked at reading and writing roman numerals up to 100 and comparing roman numerals to our own number system.

In our topic lessons, we have looked at how information is presented in wildlife guides and field guides. We have then researched animals that can be found in the rainforests of the world in order to use this information to write our own wildlife guides next week. <u>https://www.rainforestanimals.net/</u>

Year Five

In Maths this week we have revised and continued to practise rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000. We have also solved worded problems involving rounding and reminded ourselves to use RUCSAC to help. Mrs Pierce Collinao was very proud of our performance of the Spanish poem *Fiesta de la cosecha* in our Harvest Assembly. In addition to this, we have attempted some Spanish Maths to consolidate our number knowledge! In Science we have begun to explore the properties of everyday materials and carried out an investigation to see whether an ice cube would melt faster on a wooden spoon or a metal spoon (which had previously been kept in the freezer). Please ask us to explain our findings!

In English we have read more of 'Friend or Foe' and improved our dictionary and thesaurus skills to understand some old-fashioned vocabulary. We have also explored a character within a setting and have begun to develop our debating skills. Listen to Chapters 1-4 of Friend or Foe BBC Radio <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p043gw8c</u>

Year Six

In English we have read about Roald Dahl's time at boarding school and have written letters home. We have now read about lots of different times in his life such as when he went in his family's first motor car which crashed, cutting his nose almost completely off. We have used all these stories to inspire us to write our own autobiographical stories which we are going to make into a classroom book. In Maths we have been recalling and using equivalences between simple fractions, decimals and percentages in different contexts. As we have come to the end of this particular unit of work, we have consolidated our learning through games and assessment activities. In Topic we have continued to develop our investigation into the impact of exercise on our heart rates and have begun to explore the location and geography of Norway.

PE Uniform Requirements

We would request that if your child is wearing tights, as the weather becomes more inclement, that socks to change into are provided as part of their PE kit.

Parking on Kingsmead Road

There were a number of concerns raised at Parents' Forum yesterday evening and I wanted to remind you of some points to help maintain the safety of our children:

- Please be considerate when picking up and dropping children off not to block the drives of residents in the area.
- We also request that you do not to drive up School Way at any time, including dropping to Breakfast Club in the morning or collecting from any clubs. This also applies to not pulling into the road for dropping off and turning round.
- There were also concerns raised about parents who make three point turns on Kingsmead Road and who reverse onto the pavement to do so.
- Parking fully on the pavement on Kingsmead Road at the junction with School Way blocks the view of the crossing patroller and cars approaching from the opposite direction.

School Safety

At the end of the day there have been some children in the playground on scooters. The playground is very congested at the end of the day with parents, younger children and KS2 leaving the building. Children must not use their scooters during this time in this area, for everyone's safety. Scooters should not used at the top of the hill near the Key Stage 1 entrance.

Our School Council members would like to remind you that we are still collecting your used batteries for recycling. We are able to provide collection boxes, please ask at the office.

Consent for Local Trips and Walks

If you have not already done so, we would ask you to visit the Gateway, quite urgently, to give your consent for your child to take part in local trips and walks. Years 5 & 6 will be joining the Chiltern Rangers in their conservation work on Tuesday and your consent is required for this. We found having consents already in place for these smaller events very helpful and less time consuming. We will of course always let you know of when we wish to use the consent and give you full details of the event. You have the option to withdraw your consent if you wish.

Throughout this school year we plan to take each class to visit Flackwell Heath Library and borrow books for their class. We will always let you know when your child's class will be visiting the library and would like to add this to the nearby consents to avoid you needing to give permission each half term.

Contribution for Pencil Case Items

We thank everyone that has contributed to our stationery cost. We are once again asking for a contribution towards this year's stationery for your child. This is due to the continuing budget restrictions that are well publicised in the media.

In Foundation Stage and KS1 stationery is used on a 'share and share a like basis' then in year 3, when the children become more responsible, they are **given** a pencil case with everything they need.

When you click to Amazon via Easy Fundraising it will take you to AmazonSmile website. *AmazonSmile is a website operated by Amazon with the same products, prices and shopping features as <u>Amazon.co.uk</u> The difference is that when you shop on AmazonSmile, Amazon will donate 0.5% of the net purchase price (excluding VAT, returns and shipping fees) from your eligible AmazonSmile purchases to your <u>chosen charity</u>.*

We have now registered the Friends Of Loudwater School (FOLS) charity on AmazonSmile to be able to collect donations. When you first visit AmazonSmile, please select Friends of Loudwater School as your chosen charity. After this all your future Amazon purchases will raise money for the school.

Whilst there is no AmazonSmile App, it is easy enough to make sure that you use the AmazonSmile website to make your purchases. Please see the instructions below how to change and select the school as your chosen charity and add the shortcut for AmazonSmile to your smartphone/tablet

How to use AmazonSmile on your iphone / IOS

- If you have the Amazon App installed, you should remove it. To do this, tap and hold the app icon until it starts jiggle. Tap the cross at the top left of the icon and confirm that you want to delete it. Don't worry, this will not delete your Amazon account or any of your settings.
- You now need to go online via Safari (the iPhone internet browser) and go to smile.amazon.co.uk. Select Friends of Loudwater School as your charity. If not prompted to do this, click the three lines in top LH corner
