News from the classes this week:

#### **Foundation Stage**

In Foundation Stage this week we have been making the most of the weather and have been painting, measuring, using our pet shop and sandpit outside.

We have listened to the story of the 'Bad tempered Ladybird' and used this story to help us write our own stories and to act out what the ladybirds said to each other. We have also used ladybirds to help us with our maths which has been about doubling. #### Year One

In English we have been really enjoying the story of 'The 3 little wolves and the big bad pig' by Eugene Tivizas and Helen Oxenbury. Year 1 wrote questions to ask the big bad pig. We wanted to know why he had behaved so badly and if he really had changed at the end of the story. We also wrote descriptions of the houses that the 3 little wolves had built. We have also been learning about words that have been contracted and why they need an apostrophe. In Maths our focus has been on volume and capacity. The best part of our maths lessons this week has been working outside with water and a variety of containers! We had fun measuring the capacity of lots of different sized and shapes containers. In topic we undertook an investigation to find the best material to block out light. We used torches and tested different materials. #### Year Two

This week, Year 2 has been reading the story 'Penguin in Peril' by Helen Hancocks. We have written instructions on how to disguise a penguin, created a missing poster describing the penguin, given directions on how to return to the zoo and written a letter of apology from the cats. In Phonics, we have been revising the rules for adding suffixes beginning with a consonant e.g. ment, ness, ful, ly and less. In Maths, we have been exploring data and using given data to create block graphs and pictograms. We have interpreted the data to answer questions about what we have found out. In Topic, we have observed the growth, so far, of our sunflower seeds and recorded our observations giving reasons for what we saw.

#### **Year Three**

This week in English, Year 3 has been writing instructions and directions for Lucy to find her Pig Puppet doll in the wolf infested house. Towards the end of the week we planned a recount of the story and used this to write fantastic story boards.

We have started a new unit on lines and turns in Maths. We started the unit by investigating lines and turns and where we could find them in everyday life. We discussed parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical lines.

In Topic, we have been discussing the harmful effects of cigarettes and alcohol on our bodies. We created some fantastic posters on this. We have also been discussing different signs and logos that we see. We created our own and included the most important things in our lives within our logos.

#### **Year Four**

During English this week we have planned and written a newspaper report based on the events from the story 'Why the Whales Came'. We have interviewed the characters and written the report based upon Gracie's and Daniel's adventure on Samson Island. During maths this week we have learnt how to read coordinates and plot coordinates on a grid. We have had fun working out codes and writing our own codes using letters placed on a coordinate grid. During our Topic lessons we have learnt about electrical safety and made a start on our working lighthouses.

#### **Year Five**

This week in English, Year Five has met the character of nosy-neighbour Mr. Parker. We have written formal reports for the local police about what he saw in Granny's bungalow. We are really looking forward to finding out what happens in the story next.

In maths, we have been revising formal methods for column addition and subtraction. As well as this, we have been working to convert different units of metric measures and solve problems using time. We have also been looking at converting between fractions and decimals and finding fractions of amounts.

In topic lessons, Year Five has been learning about the carbon cycle, and the reproductive cycles of flowering and non-flowering plants. We have drawn diagrams to illustrate these, and have explored the outside area to collect different examples of seeds, which we will look at under the microscopes next week.

#### Year Six

In English this week, we have written persuasive letters to the Council to ask permission to reproduce some of our amazing graffiti art work and also to request a small grant to purchase paint and other equipment needed. We have also started to consider the negative sides and effects of graffiti. In preparation for our SATs next week, we have also revised many aspects of grammar and the spelling strategies for ie/ei, hyphens, adding suffixes to words ending –fer. In Maths we have been revising and consolidating our learning of arithmetic and problem solving and reasoning.
