# News from the classes this week: Foundation Stage

Since we came back after half term, the adults in FS have been amazed at how well we are doing with Phonics. We have shown that we really know the sounds that have been taught, and that we can use them to sound out and then blend words. The new sounds this week have been h, b, f and I, and the Tricky Words that we have learnt are "no & go".

In Literacy we have read a story called 'Smile Crocodile' and we have been talking about our favourite characters and why we like them. We have also made a story map to help us to retell the story. This book has also reminded us how important it is to clean our teeth twice a day, very carefully.

In Maths we have continued learning about 1, 2 & 3. We can recognise the numbers and are working on writing them. We have also sung number songs, counted up to and back from 10.

Our topic work has focused on fireworks and Diwali.

### Year One

It has been a very exciting week in Year One!

https://www.hearingdogs.org.uk/about/ Next week we are going to be completing our sponsored walk to raise some funds for them. In Maths we have been investigating number bonds to 10. We have been using a part whole model to help us find the pairs of numbers that

total 10. We have also been using a 10 frame.

In RE we have been learning all about how and why Diwali is celebrated. We enjoyed finding out about the story of Rama and Sita. We also enjoyed making our own diva cards and firework pictures.

In Science we have been investigating the properties of the materials that the three little pigs used to build their homes.

#### **Year Two**

In English, we have been using the film text 'Bubbles' to support our reading for writing skills. We have made predictions about what might happen next at different points in the story. We also sequenced events from the story, thinking about the character's emotions to help us plot the events on an emotions graph. In Phonics, we have been learning about the rules for adding the suffix -s and -es to create plurals. In Guided Reading, we have read the end of 'That Rabbit belongs to Emily Brown' by Cressida Cowell. We used prediction, inference and wondering skills to understand the plot, retrieval skills to answer questions and sequencing skills to order events.

In Maths, we have been learning how to check our calculations by using the inverse operation. We have also practised comparing number sentences using <, > and =. We have also been revising number bonds to 20.

On Wednesday we enjoyed a visit from the Hearing Dogs charity. They came to tell us about their important work and even brought 2 dogs to visit us! In return, we are going to support them by completing a sponsored walk. More information about this will be given to you soon.

In our DT lesson, we visited the woods to build mini shelters for Castaway Clive. We had a lovely time and built some creative shelters. In PSHE, we discussed the question 'What makes a good friend?' and we created a friendship soup recipe containing lots of characteristics of a good friend. In Computing, we have begun a new unit on programming.

# **Year Three**

This week in English, we held a mock trial for Alexander Wolf from our text 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs'. During the trial, the witness read their statements and the jury found the wolf guilty of his crimes. We then watched the recording of the trial and discussed how we thought it went. This week we have also planned and written newspaper reports about the trial.

In Maths, we have used resources to help us add and subtract 3 digit and 2-digit numbers, using exchanging and regrouping. We have also completed a mental maths test involving various calculations.

In PSHE, we have been learning about keeping safe. In PE we have started our new sports which are hockey and dance. In Spanish, we have learnt about 'dia de los

muertos' (Day of the Dead). We have learnt how the Spanish tradition started and what people do to celebrate it. #### **Year Four**

During our English lessons this week, we have created our own creatures using Arthur Spiderwick's Field Guide as inspiration. We have used our knowledge of non-chronological reports to write reports about our creatures. We then looked at how we can edit and improve our writing, and finally published our writing for our very own 'Year 4 Field Guide to the World Around You!' In our reading sessions, we have read the remainder of the story and used our deductive skills to make inferences based upon the character's thoughts, feelings and actions.

During our maths lessons this week, we have worked hard on subtracting 4-digit numbers where exchanges take place. We have used place value counters to represent this before using the formal column method of subtraction. We have also looked at using the most efficient method based upon the subtraction calculation we are trying to solve. During our science lessons this week, we have found out about teeth. We have learnt about the names of the different teeth and their functions, and compared and identified animal teeth depending upon whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores. During our PE lessons, we have started to learn the different skills required in basketball. In our RE lessons, we found out about Christian beliefs about God and The Holy Trinity. Our homework this week is to practise column subtraction. More information can be found on Google Classroom.

#### **Year Five**

Our Guided Reading text this week has been a song text: 'Firework' by Katy Perry (a very seasonal choice!). We have enjoyed listening to and analysing the lyrics and have been asked to apply our inference skills to discuss why the song may have been written and what its message might be.

In Maths, we have started our statistics topic and revised reading and interpreting tables, bar charts and line graphs. We also practised drawing our own bar chart, where we had to think carefully about our axes and scales. Mrs. PC asked us to then write some questions about our bar chart that a friend could answer.

In English this week we have been focussing on the features of a scientific report and linking this with our Science lessons where we have been investigating air resistance. We used a model text to extract useful subtitles which would help us write any scientific report. Please ask us to explain what the following letters represent: T?, A, H, C, V, E, S, M, D (L), R, C.

In Science lessons we described the amount of air resistance we felt while running outside with a piece of flat cardboard. Some of us changed the angle of the cardboard, how and where we held it. We tried very hard to run at the same speed each time but realised this was a tricky constant to control. We then undertook a practical session, making three parachutes – each slightly different but ensuring we only changed one variable each time. We look forward to launching these and observing which falls to the ground the slowest, thus ensuring a safe landing for any skydiver. Next week, we will compare our results and, as each team had a different material to use, decide which would make the best parachute for skydivers and why.

In PE, we enjoyed learning a non-locomotor move routine to Bhangra music for our new Bollywood dance unit. We were also very lucky to have been invited to the Beaconsfield School by the Bucks Music Trust to see the Graveney Music Senior Choir perform before beginning its tour of the Midlands.

#### **Year Six**


In English this week, we have started a new unit of work based on the book, 'The Promise' by Nicola Davies. We have read the story and have used the text to identify antonyms, look closely at the effect of a prefix on a word and have used modal verbs to express possibility. We have also investigated the different ways that noun phrases are created, identified different forms of figurative language such as similes, metaphors and personification and have used a simile as a fronted adverbial.

In Maths, we started the week by dividing using factors eg 720  $\div$  80 would be 720  $\div$  10  $\div$  8. We have also begun our journey to long division mastery. We have used a series of steps to success, to support our calculations.



#### Success criteria

- 1. List multiples of the divisor (are you going to do repeated addition or partition and add?)
- 2. Divide
- 3. Multiply
- 4. Subtract
- 5. Bring it down...
- 6. ...and bring it on back!



In PSHE, we have started to explore the importance of good dental health. In RE, we have continued our discussions and activities on how the life and teachings of Buddha can influence how we live our lives today. In Music, we have discussed what music means to us and the influence it has on the world. This week, we have been enjoying the music of Oasis.


