News from the classes this week:

# **Foundation Stage**

On Monday, Foundation Stage walked from school to the war memorial. Following on from the Remembrance Service that we took part in at the Church on Friday, we went to see the "Names on the stone" that we had learnt about. It was a beautiful morning and everyone walked along chatting happily. At the stone we paid our respects and saw the poppies that we had helped to make. The Foundation Stage staff were extremely proud of us, we were sensible and safety conscious, well behaved and respectful, both at the war memorial and of the local residents who were also out and about. The adults were proud to walk with the children.

We have been reading a story about "The tiger who came to tea" by Judith Kerr. We were shocked to find that a tiger had come to tea in our classroom and had eaten all OUR food, so we had to make shopping lists of all the food that we needed to replace. We were careful to write Tiger Food on our list, just in case he was still hungry! In maths we have been counting and adding tigers and in phonics we have been learning to read High Frequency Words.

#### **Year One**

This week, in English, we have been learning about how to write questions. We now know that they need to start with a question word and end with a question mark. We also talked about how they need to make sense. We wrote our own questions about elephants and we had some super ideas which we shared with Miss Brown. We did some research to try and find the answer to some of these questions and we then wrote our own information about elephants. We looked at the difference between fiction and non-fiction writing.

In Maths we have been focusing on the names and properties of 3d shapes. We used the words curved and straight in order to sort a selection of 3d shapes. We also learnt about edges, faces and vertices! On Thursday we had great fun being 3d shape detectives around the school.

In our topic learning we have loved learning about Diwali. We learnt how and why this colourful festival is celebrated. Year 1 loved creating our own firework pictures with pastels to show a Diwali celebration.

#### **Year Two**

This week, in Year 2, we have been enjoying the story 'Dogger' by Shirley Hughes. We have focused on using our comprehension skills to gain a deeper meaning of the story and to understand the author's choice of vocabulary. We have sequenced events in the story, created a 'Lost' poster describing Dogger, written a letter to Dave from Dogger and devised a set of instructions about 'How to look after a favourite toy'. In Topic, we are using our learning from our trip to Wycombe Museum to help Iggy the Alien to learn about toys in order to get his dream job as one of Santa's helpers! In Phonics, we are revising compound words. We are identifying, reading, writing and understanding compound words, so that we can use them in our reading and writing.

#### **Year Three**

In English this week, we have been continuing the story of the Dragon Slayer. At the beginning of the week, we discussed the structure of narrative stories and planned what we wanted to write. We then used our plans to structure our writing into an introduction, build up, problem, resolution and end. At the end of the week, we used our editing skills to make our writing even better.

In Maths, we have been looking at Multiplication and Division. We discussed words like product, sharing, and grouping in great detail. We found products of multiplication sentences and calculated division statements too. We looked at dividing by 3 and dividing by 4 along with solving problems including these ideas at the end of the week. In the afternoons we have been starting to talk about Hadrian's Wall. We watched part of a BBC documentary and took notes to help us with our writing. We then looked at how the Romans introduced Christianity and then wrote narratives with imaginative description. https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/clips/zhq76sq

#### **Year Four**

In English this week, we have been planning and writing the next chapter of our book 'The Firework-maker's Daughter'. For this, we have looked at how we can include different writing elements in our chapter such as a setting description, speech and action scenes. We have also looked at resolutions and endings for the chapter.

In maths this week, we have looked at different methods of multiplication. We have learned how to multiply three digit numbers and learned how to identify factor pairs of a number. We have then used this to help up solve multiplication calculations more efficiently. In topic this week, we have planned and carried out an investigation to find out what happens to the volume of sound as it travels over a distance. We thought of the variables that we needed to change and what we needed to keep the same in order for the test to be fair. #### **Year Five**

This week in English, Year Five has been working hard to write a diary entry for a World War One soldier during the Christmas Day truce in 1914. We had to think carefully about the different emotions a soldier would be experiencing, and we worked hard to develop effective similes and metaphors to include in our work.

In maths, Year Five has been continuing to explore multiplication and division. We have been using square and cube numbers, as well as practising multiplying and dividing any number by 10, 100 and 1000. We have also been developing our methods for mental calculation and using these to solve problems.

In topic lessons Year Five has been investigating how to separate different materials using sieving, filtration and evaporation and have also been learning how propaganda posters were used during World War One and Two for campaigns such as Dig for Victory, Make Do and Mend, and the Women's Land Army.

#### **Year Six**

In English this week we have been focusing on a new unit of work called 'Pandora'. We have been exploring the planet of Pandora, as seen in the film 'Avatar'. We have started to write a non-chronological report on this fascinating planet. We have written an introductory paragraph and have created a creature that could live on the planet. We are now going to write about its diet and habitat. Our grammar focus has been on relative clauses, fronted adverbials and fronted subordinate clauses. Our spelling focus this week has been words ending –ant, –ance and –ancy. In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of long division. This is a challenging Year 6 objective and we would all benefit from further practice of this method. On Tuesday we took part in the Primary Maths Challenge. Certificates for this challenge were issued in Friday's assembly. On Monday we walked to the Loudwater War Memorial to pay our respects and to see the wreaths and poppies laid during the Remembrance Service on Sunday. On Friday we had our final Mini-Enterprise Competition practice in preparation of the actual competition next Wednesday. The children selected to attend will bring home letters on Friday.
