News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

We have all had a brilliant first week at school, with very few tears and everyone looking smart in their new school uniforms. We are very excited about the things we are going to learn. This week we have sat and listened beautifully and have all answered the register. Our lining up after playtimes has been so good that other members of staff have complimented us! We have done drawings and paintings, built with bricks and lego, practiced writing, used numbers, heard stories, used computers, completed puzzles, used playdough, played with sand and rice and water, waited on tables in our cafe role play area, danced and sung on our stage and used our playground area to throw and catch bean bags and to run around. We have also shown that we are great at tidying up! What a wonderful start to our time at Loudwater School.

Year One

This week in English we have been busy thinking about what we would like to be when we grow up. We listed lots of different jobs and wrote sentences about some of them. In Maths we have been learning about more and less. We used number lines and cubes to help us to find 1 more and 1 less of numbers to 10 and beyond. We have also been working on writing all of our numbers correctly. Our topic this half term is Ourselves. We have drawn some super self-portraits which have been put on display in the class. We have enjoyed thinking about the jobs we want to do when we are older and thought about how we will change as we grow up so that we can do these jobs.

Year Two

Year 2 has settled well into the new school year and are happily engaged and focused in our learning! In English this week we have been focusing on a whole school project called "Big Me" in support of Action Aid. We have made posters about ourselves, role played travelling forwards in time to meet our future self and planned and written a letter to read in the future. In Maths, we have been revising partitioning 2-digit numbers and using partitioning methods to solve problems. In Topic we have created a collage of the person we would like to be when we are grown up. In Phonics we have revised the long vowel phonemes ai, ee, igh, oa, oo. It has been a busy first full week! Year Three

This week in English we have been talking and writing about what we want to be when we are older. To start the week, we used research skills to gather information and then wrote fantastic reports. Towards the end of the week, we wrote letters to ourselves explaining what we need to do in order to achieve our ambitions. In Maths we have been learning about numbers and place value. We have been representing different numbers by using base 10 and place value counters as well as adding numbers together using these apparatus. Towards the end of the week, we discussed how bridging works and how we can exchange 10 units for 1 ten and 10 tens for 1 hundred. We have been particularly enthusiastic about starting our new topic of Active Planet. Year Four

Year 4 has enjoyed settling back into our first full week of school after the break. In English we have been looking at The Big Me and have completed research and a report on a career that we might like to do when we grow up. We have also written a letter to our future selves about our chosen jobs. In Maths we have been counting in threes, sixes and nines as well as finding the value of digits in four digit numbers. We have enjoyed designing and making shelters for our topic this week (when it hasn't rained!) and have also explored the true meaning of the word 'home'.

Year Five

This week in English, Year 5 has been researching and writing about jobs we might like to have in the future. We have looked at the skills and qualifications we would need, as well as what subjects we would have to study at school and what the job role entails. Year 5 has then used this information to write non-chronological reports and letters to our future selves. In maths Year 5 has been practising and improving our knowledge of place value. We have made numbers in different ways and then used these to order and compare six digit numbers using inequality brackets. We have also been rounding numbers with up to six digits to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. We have had an exciting start to our new topic Making New Materials. We have been revising their knowledge of solids, liquids and gases and have investigated freezing and melting. Year Five has also made a new material (salt dough!) and have created plaited harvest wreaths to decorate St. Peter's Church this weekend.

Year Six

It has been lovely to welcome all the new Year 6 pupils in to class and they have all made a very positive start to this year. In English, we have been focussed on our whole school project, 'Big Me'. We have thought about what job/career we would like to have when we are older. We have researched these occupations and used that information to write non-chronological reports (information texts). We have also written letters to our future selves, telling them about our future aspirations as well as details of the life as a 10/11 year old. In Maths, we have been exploring place value. Our activities have included: recognising the position/value of digits in a number, multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 and working with number in the millions. Our topic for this half term is The Holiday Show. We have been revising their geography skills by locating continents and oceans and popular cities and countries around the world. Year 6 have also completed our 11+ tests this week.

Staff will be available to supervise children on the Key Stage 2 playground if required whilst the presentations are in progress.

Some reminders

The children are looking very smart in their school uniforms. Please can you help us by making sure that:

- children in key stage one bring only a PE kit and their book bag to school please
 do not send them with rucksacks or large bags as there is not enough space to
 store these in cloakrooms.
- PE kits are brought into school on a Monday and taken home on a Friday.

As you are no doubt aware, the weather this week has not been conducive to swimming, this combined with the fact that our renovation work has been unfortunately delayed means that we are realistically now not going to be able to swim this year. A big disappointment but we will have a great new facility ready and waiting for next summer – thank you all for your understanding.

Hot Lunches

For those parents new to the school, we have now set up your individual links to our school meals provider – Dolce Live Kitchen. You will have by now received an email to the address that you have already supplied and this will confirm that you have access and gives you a user and password – just follow the instructions as it will outline the order process.

Please be aware that should you not see the email in your regular inbox, check your spam as it may well have found its way there.

Sickness - 48 hour rule

Given that we are entering in to the autumn, we have noticed already that there seems to be various bugs circulating. In order to minimise the risk of infection please ensure that should your child become infected with a sickness bug then please observe the 48 hour rule; meaning that they should remain away from school for 48 hours from the last sickness incident. Refer to the general sickness policy on the website or in the case of new starters – in the guidance notes in the starter pack.

All clubs are due to start week beginning September 25th. We have today sent out, with pupils, the information letters from our outside organisers. If you have not received an expected letter please check with your child that they have given their teacher the request slip. We do have spares in the office if required.
