News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage we have listened to the story "What the ladybird heard". We have used this story as a starting point for our writing and we have made and labelled maps of the farmyard. In Maths we have been finding out more about halving and doubling and practising taking away. We have a lovely new Garden Centre in our outside area and the children have been buying and selling seeds and plants and writing their shopping lists.

Year One

In English we have been using different story books to research big bad wolves! We then wrote about them using the headings of diet, appearance and behaviour. We have also written a fantastic character description of Rolf, the good little wolf. On Friday we had fun unjumbling lots of sentences. We remembered that they needed to start with a capital letter and end with a full stop.

In Maths we have been solving addition and subtraction problems. We read the questions carefully to find out which operation we needed and we also highlighted the numbers that we needed to add or subtract. We have also been finding the difference between 2 numbers and working out the missing numbers in addition and subtraction sentences.

This week in topic, we have been looking at the Briar Rose paintings by the artist Edward Burne-Jones. We were pictures detectives and looked very carefully at the paintings to find out more about what was in each painting. We also talked about the story that was represented in these pictures. The paintings are at Buscot Park in Oxford and we had fun making a visitor's guide so that other people could really enjoy these paintings. http://www.phonicsplay (phases 3-5)

Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have enjoyed the story 'My Teacher is a Monster'. We have described the characters of Bobby and Miss Kirby, created instructions for 'How to make a paper aeroplane' and written a descriptive poem about Miss Kirby. We have also

carried out some English assessments this week. In Phonics we have been revising the rules for adding suffixes beginning with a consonant such as ment, ness, less and ly. In Maths, we have been revising the properties of 3D shapes, measuring weight, length and capacity and estimating and comparing measures. In Topic, we have explored things that are alive, not alive and never been alive, as well as observing the growth of our sunflowers. Year Three

This week in English, Year 3 has been writing instructions and directions for Lucy to find her Pig Puppet doll in the wolf infested house. Towards the end of the week we planned a recount of the story and used this to write fantastic story boards. We have started a new unit on lines and turns in Maths. We started the unit by investigating lines and turns and where we could find them in everyday life. We discussed parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical lines. In Topic, we have been discussing the harmful effects of cigarettes and alcohol on our bodies. We created some fantastic posters about this. https://www.bbc.com/education/clips/z42w2hv

Year Four

In English this week we have completed our independent writing for this unit of work. Our writing was a newspaper report based around the events on Bryher the day the whales came, from the book we have been reading from by Michael Morpurgo. In Maths this week we have been counting in multiples of 25, finding 1000 more and 1000 less than a number and learning about the place value of money. We have then applied our knowledge of counting in 25s to working with money. In our topic lessons this week, we have continued to make our working lighthouses by following our designs or adapting them if needed, ready to build working circuits for the

This week in English, Year Five has written newspaper reports about the theft of the crown jewels and the suspicious evidence which was found at the scene. We have also started a longer piece of independent writing about what happened to Ben at his dance competition.

In maths, Year Five has been tackling the formal methods for long and short multiplication. We have worked really hard with this and have started to use this method to solve problems.

In topic lessons, Year Five has been looking at different seeds and seed heads found in the school grounds and have sorted these into the different ways in which the seeds are dispersed. We have also written our values assembly which we are looking forward to performing on Thursday 24th May.

Our new and improved pool!

As many children already know, the Loudwater School pool is now back in operation, after a long hiatus. This is thanks to a lot of people, both staff members and the wider community who have worked together to get the pool refurbished. We are very grateful for their time and energy, as well as for contributions to much needed funding. Swimming is part of the PE curriculum for many year groups. Swimming is supervised by a qualified swimming teacher as well as class teachers, and is of course an important life skill as well as a great form of exercise. Many schools no longer have the benefit of their own pool, so we consider ourselves very fortunate to have such a great resource on site. A pool is not considered an essential facility, so funding is not routinely given to support keeping it up and running.

Getting the pool ready has cost in the region of £20,000 - we have been fortunate to secure some grant funding, but the remainder has needed to come from school funds, which rightly are always very carefully monitored and are a finite resource. This is just one of the reasons why we rely on FOLS to help support us in our quest to provide Loudwater School children with the best possible learning experiences, by helping us to maximise the budget we have.

If you could donate an hour of your time to the school, perhaps to support poolside at swimming sessions; or could contribute to some fundraising - whether big or small, your support is always welcome. Please contact the office, one of the school governors or a member of FOLS for more information.
