Flu and Coronavirus Information

It has been quite some time since we received an update from government about flu and coronavirus but we were provided with a number of reminders this week as flu and coronavirus are currently circulating at high levels and, as a result of social mixing and along with the return to school, cases are likely to increase in the coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever which is caused by group A streptococcus also continue to be reported.

This reminder comes from Professor Susan Hopkins, Chief Medical Adviser at the US Health Security Agency (UKHSA):

- It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.
- Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.
- Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if you do have to go out, wear a face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people unless urgent.

As a school we will be following this advice to try and minimise any increase in numbers of infections at school as far as we practicably can. We know that parents will be keen to send their children to school as many of them have missed time at school last half term, but it is very clear that children with a fever, that is a temperature that is **37.8°C or higher** should remain at home until their temperature returns to normal. If your child has a cold and runny nose, please could they bring tissues to school with them.

If your child did not have the flu vaccination at school this is still available for all primary aged children and is the best protection against the virus. There has been good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.
