News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have been learning about our bodies. We have listened to the story Funny Bones and have named all the different parts of our bodies. We have looked at a diagram of a body and labelled it. We have learnt some of the names of our bones. In Maths we have been working practically to add two groups of items and have continued to practise counting, reading and writing numbers. Year One

English: Year 1 have really enjoyed our new story, Where The Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak. They have been sequencing the story and have also been describing the wild things by using lots of great adjectives. They really enjoyed the Perform Drama workshop which took us on an underwater adventure.

Maths: This week we have been busy looking at odd and even numbers. We learnt an even numbers chant which has been very helpful when we have been sorting numbers. We have also been ordering the days of the week and the months of the year. We really enjoyed making our days and months wheels to help us.

Topic: This week in topic we thought about the qualities that make a really good friend. Year 1 have also been busy creating maps to show our nature area. While we were creating our maps we enjoyed watching the pond skaters and other wildlife around the pond. Useful website which focuses on odd and even numbers...

Year Two

This week, the Year 2 children have been continuing to write their own information text about The Great Fire of London. They are learning how to use captions, sub-headings, labels and detailed facts to interest their audience. They also enjoyed a free Perform Drama workshop this week. The theme was Under the Sea. Everyone had an enjoyable time! In Phonics, they have been learning the rules for adding the suffixes –er and –est to change verbs into nouns and to compare objects. In Maths, the children have been adding and subtracting multiples of ten to a 2-digit number. The main focus has been on observing the pattern and explaining why this happens. Although they were able to calculate with accuracy, they found explaining and reasoning rather challenging! In Topic, the children have been observing which materials objects are made of and describing how these materials change over time.

Year Three

In English, Year 3 started the week by finalising their newspaper reports on Mount. Vesuvius. They have written fantastic descriptions of volcanoes and have also written diary entries.

In Maths, Year 3 have started a new unit on mental calculation strategies. The children have looked at when and where these strategies come in useful. They have learned to use the rounding strategy and the bridging 10 strategy to help them. Towards the end of the week we looked at applying these to problem solving and reasoning questions.

In Topic this week we have been continuing to look at rocks. We have found out about igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks and have written rock diaries. We also used our brilliant pieces of Home Learning to discuss Serena and Venus Williams and how they grew up and became champions.

Year Four

Year 4 have been working hard on publishing their Just So Stories this week and have written some really pleasing and well thought out stories! Some of the stories are now on display outside the library so look out for them next time you are in school. In maths we have been looking at factors and calculating. Within this, we have been learning to count in 6s, 9s and 12s and have been learning the related multiplication facts for these numbers. Finally, we have applied our knowledge of multiplication facts to solve word problems. During our topic lessons we have researched food chains in different habitats. We found out the animals and the order that they fit into that particular food chain, before finding out labels such as 'primary consumer' and 'predator' to describe the animals. We then used the information we had found out to create our very own food chain mobiles. We also completed some research on migratory animals and their migration habits.

Year Five

This week Year Five have been designing their own sweets for Willy Wonka's chocolate factory to make. They have also written non-chronological reports about the Oompa-Loompas and have created their own character to visit the factory. They have then presented these to the class and used some very entertaining drama!

In Maths, Year Five have been looking at a range of mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. They have used rounding and adjusting, counting on and bar modelling alongside column methods.

In Topic, Year Five have discussed the process of dissolving and have been investigating how to separate mixtures using sieving, filtration and evaporation. They had to predict the outcomes and then once they had their results, decide which method would be the most effective.

Year Six

In English this week, we have been read about Roald Dahl's terrifying experience when his family bought their first car. It was driven by his elder sister who manage to crash it on their first outing, throwing Roald through the windscreen and almost cutting his nose completely off. We have then written our own autobiographical story in the anecdotal style of Roald Dahl.

In Maths, we have been using reordering using the commutative law and BIDMAS (brackets, indices, division, multiplication, addition and subtraction) to help us understand the order that calculations need to be completed. We have also had our first lessons on algebra where we were able to develop an understanding that we were using letters to represent numbers that we did not yet know.

In Topic, we have finished writing balanced arguments as to whether a theme park should be built on the Rye.


