News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

This week we have started listening to stories by Judith Kerr. She has written lots of children's books, many of them about the cat Mog. We have enjoyed the stories and have been describing Mog. We have noticed the change in the weather and have been talking about the four seasons and made a season's clock.

We have also started thinking about our new topic, "People who help us." We discussed all the people who help us, at home, at school, and when we are out and about. We have a doctor's surgery in our playground now and the doctors and nurses have been helping all the patients who have visited the surgery.

Year One

In English this week Year 1 have been introduced to David McKee, our new class author. We have enjoyed listening to stories about his most famous character; Elmer the patchwork elephant. We made an amazing collection of adjectives to describe Elmer and we used some of these when writing sentences. We also used the word **and** to join 2 adjectives together in one sentence. We have enjoyed writing our own Elmer books which we are going to share with the Foundation Stage class.

In Maths, we have been learning about multiples of 10. We now know that they end in 0. We have sorted numbers into those are multiples of 10 and those that are not. We also been finding 10 more and 10 less of 2 digit multiples of 10.

Our new topic is called "Let's Celebrate". We have been thinking about what we like to do when we celebrate. This weekend is Bonfire Night and we have made firework safety posters. We also really enjoyed making firework pictures using chalks and pastels. Website for some fun Elmer activities....

Year Two

This week Year 2 has been learning about The Gunpowder Plot. We have posed questions that we would like to ask Guy Fawkes, if we had the chance to meet him! Also, we have created a Wanted poster to describe Guy Fawkes, written a recount of the events and composed a bonfire night poem. In Topic, we have written a letter to King James I to tell him about the plot and created a firework display picture using chalks and pastels. In Phonics, we have revisited the rules for adding the suffixes -s or -es to create plurals or present tense verbs. In Maths, we have been naming 2D and 3D shapes, describing patterns, extending patterns and creating patterns of our own. www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/ks1/maths/shapes/play/

Year Three

In English this week we started looking at an animation called 'Dragon Slayer.' To start the week we developed our understanding of how and why characters change. We have also been discussing characters' thoughts and feelings at different points throughout the story as well as writing setting descriptions and diary entries.

In Maths, we have been revising addition and subtraction calculation strategies. We have used Mathematical apparatus such as base 10 and place value counters to help us before moving onto adding and subtracting 3 digit numbers using the extended column method. Towards the end of the week we looked at problem solving and reasoning questions involving these ideas.

We have started our new Topic of the Nature of Life this week. We have started talking about our targets and discussed how plants and animals grow. The children were very enthusiastic to show their brilliant Home Learning projects that they had completed over half term. Year Four

In English we have started reading "The Spiderwick Chronicles" this week. We have used this as inspiration to write with lots of description, with a focus on using strong adjectives effectively. We have also written diary entries for the main character, Jared.

In maths, we have been learning to use the grid method of multiplication to multiply a one digit number by a two-digit number. We have also solved two-step problems involving multiplication and addition.

During our topic lessons we have been learning about our new topic, Land, Sea and Sky. We have begun to compare aquatic plants with land plants and find out how aquatic plants have adapted to their habitat.

Year Five

This week in English, Year 5 has started to read the narrative poem "The Highwayman" by Alfred Noyes. We have learned about some notorious real-life highwaymen who operated in our local area, and have begun to explore the characters of The Highwayman, Bess and Tim.

In maths, Year 5 has been using mental methods for multiplication and division. We have been finding multiples and factors for different numbers, and have been investigating square and cube numbers. We have also been using these skills for problem solving and reasoning.

Year 5 has started a new topic called Space Explorers. This week we have presented our fantastic home learning projects to the class and have also worked in teams to create a rocket to transfer vital supplies from Earth the International Space Station. We are really excited to learn more about space in the next few weeks.

Year Six

In English this week, we have discovered that there has been some unusual activity around the rings of Saturn. Upon closer inspection, we have noticed that there is evidence of alien activity. We have been subsequently approached by Sir Matthew Floyd Weaver, the Head of SPREAD (Society for the Protection and Relocation of Extra-terrestrial Alien Dwellers) to apply for the prestigious position of researcher. We have written formal persuasive letters of application and have shown our research skills by writing a biography on Galileo Galilei, the famous astronomer.

In Maths, we have been using factorising to support our mental calculations, multiplying and dividing decimals, calculating the mean and using the bar method to develop our understanding of ratio and proportion.

In Topic, we have been looking at how natural disasters impact on tourism. In pairs, we have researched a natural disaster and presented our finding to the rest of the class. kidshealth.org/en/kids/heart.html – The heart and circulatory system.
