News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

This week we found out that it was Goldilocks who had caused the problems in our playground. We listened to the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', and now it all starts to make sense! Goldilocks wrote an apology to Baby Bear and we have replied to her on Baby Bear's behalf as he is too little to write to her himself. We also found some screws outside. They had fallen out of Baby Bears chair, which must be why it broke, so we have managed to screw the chair back together and Baby Bear is much happier now! We have also been learning about old and new teddy bears and have been noticing the similarities and differences between them.

We have used salt dough to make little teddies and we have used our Bear Number lines to work out subtraction problems.

Year One

In English this week we have been using lots of adjectives to describe the 3 little pigs and the big bad wolf. We used more than one adjective in our sentences and we joined them by using the word **and**. We worked hard to fill in the missing punctuation marks in sentences. We had to use a full stop, an exclamation mark or a question mark. We also had to explain why we used these punctuation marks. In Maths this week has been a busy addition and subtraction week. We have been focussing on the accurate use of a number line. In topic - we have been learning about the different types of buildings that we have in Loudwater and on Thursday we were lucky enough to visit one of these. We learnt all about Tesco and what happens inside the building. We also thought about the features that we saw on our journey to Tesco and we have been putting these on a map to show our journey. Year 1 were a pleasure to take to Tesco!

Year Two

This week Year 2 has enjoyed the end of 'The owl who was afraid of the dark'. They have spent the week planning, writing and editing their own version of the story. In Phonics they have been revising knowledge of the rules for adding suffixes such as -er, -est, -less and - ful. In Maths they have revisited addition and subtraction strategies, using them to solve missing number sentences using the inverse. In Topic, they have created a timeline to show how humans grow and develop over time.

Year Three

This week in English, Year 3 has been continuing the text 'Wolves in the Walls'. We have started reading the story and thinking about how Lucy feels. At the beginning of the week they started by sharing emotions through drama. They then predicted what might happen in the next sections of the story by drawing pictures and writing captions. In Maths the children have been looking at written and mental methods of adding three digit numbers. They have looked at adding in different representatives and by using a range of mathematical equipment. In topic we have been focusing on the human skeleton and its functions. The children have started looking at the muscles that we have in our bodies and how these allow us to move during physical activity and in everyday life. http://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/ks2/science/living_things/skeletons_muscles/read/1/

Year Four

In English this week, Year 4 has been practising the use of descriptive language in various activities. The children have created posters advertising the show/circus from the 'other world' in 'Coraline'. They have explored the use of superlatives to describe a door of their own design and have written descriptions of what might be found behind the door. In Maths they have practised mental methods to add or subtract four digit numbers including those with decimals. They have used these techniques to solve problems involving money. In Topic the children have built working electrical circuits and have designed a switch to include into their circuit. They have also tried out different materials to see which conduct electricity and which do not.

Year Five

This week in English Year 5 has been reading more about 'Gangsta Granny'. They have written instructions about how to fool their parents that they are doing what they are supposed to be...for example tidying their rooms, finishing their dinners or even pretending to do their homework! They have also imagined that they are Granny overhearing Ben being unkind about her, and have written scripts for a phone call to Silverline to ask for advice. In maths, Year five has been using estimates and using written and mental methods to add and subtract numbers with up to three decimal places. They have also linked their science and maths work by calculating the carbon content of the trees they have measured. In topic, Year Five has been measuring trees! They have measured the circumference and used this to calculate the height and carbon content. This is part of the BBC Terrific Scientific project and links to their learning about deforestation, climate change and the local environment. They have also enjoyed revisiting animal classification. http://www.earlybritishkingdoms.com/kids/index.html

Year Six

In English this week, Year 6 has started a new unit of work based on the theme of graffiti. They have researched and written an information text on the origins of graffiti, the history of graffiti, the different styles and a popular graffiti artist. They have also started to explore some features of persuasive writing in preparation for their writing next week. In grammar they have been revising contractions, passive and active sentences and the subjunctive form of the verb. In Maths, Year 6 has been revising area and perimeter, time and calendars, the mean of a set of data and reasoning questions. In Topic, Year 6 has started their training as Forensic Scientists. They have conducted a chromatography investigation using black ink. They discovered that black ink is not actual made with black but a range of different colours such as blue, red and yellow. They have also investigated whether all black ink pens contain the same colours.
