Dear Parents and Carers,

We do not underestimate the challenges that this has provided you at home, as well as how this has increased the workload for all staff of the school.

Whilst this week has seen an extension to the partial closure of schools and the continuation of the attendance in schools for vulnerable children and those children of key workers. I wanted to highlight that our risk assessment is in place and reviewed when necessary.
