News from the classes this week: Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have continued our learning about the story "We're going on a bear hunt" by Michael Rosen. We have recycled the story, to make up new sections for it. We have added a park, a trampoline, a town and a time machine for the children to adventure through, but luckily we have still not seen any real bears! Our Phonic work has focused on sounding out words to spell them, and our confidence with this is really growing. We are becoming very resourceful and are able to use sound mats to help us find the sounds we want to write. If you want to use sound mats at home, we use the Phase 2 & 3 mats, which you can find here:

Also in topic work we have started learning about polar bears and finding that they are quite different to brown bears, in many ways.

Our Maths learning for the next few weeks is a consolidation of all the learning we have done this term. We have been finding different ways of making the numbers up to 10, and subitising, which is recognising how many objects there are without having to count them.

Year One

This week has been Shakespeare week at Loudwater School. We have learnt lots of information about the famous playwright William Shakespeare. Our focus story this week has been the tragedy of Romeo and Juliet. We sequenced this very sad story as a class and then we wrote a review of it. On Friday we watched a modern day version of this story which was much happier; 'Gnomeo and Juliet'. We talked about the differences between this version and the original. In guided reading we have loved the story of 'The New Small Person' by Lauren Child.

Our focus in Maths has been counting in groups of 2 and in groups of 5. We have done this very well but a bit more practice grouping objects in 2's and 5's at home and then counting them would be really beneficial and good fun!

In Science we have been learning about the similarities and differences between the different groups of animals. We learnt the names of the different animal groups and sorted animals into these groups. If you are not quite sure about the names and

In our PSHE lesson we have been thinking about the people who help us. We brainstormed lots of the people who help us such as doctors, teachers, police, dentists and many more. In RE we have really enjoyed learning about how Eid is celebrated, thank you to some great input from the children.

Year Two

This week we have enjoyed celebrating Shakespeare Week! We have learned about the story of Romeo and Juliet. After hearing the story told by Mrs Olcot, we sequenced the important events and created freeze frames of each event. These were really good (please see the photos on eschools)! We also wrote a recount as a guest at Lord Capulet's party, a letter from Friar Laurence to Romeo and a recipe for a sleeping potion for Juliet. We have really enjoyed this story and can retell the events with understanding. In Phonics, we have been revising the rules for adding the suffixes –ing and –ed to verbs, and –er and –est to adjectives. We have focused on the 'change the y to an i' rule. In Guided Reading, we have explored tricky vocabulary from the story of Romeo and Juliet. We answered retrieval questions about the story and sequence events in chronological order.

In Maths we have continued to learn the names and properties of 2d shapes. We have focused on the number of sides and vertices each shape has, and how that helps us to identify each shape.

In Science, we have begun to learn about different habitats and why animals are suited to these environments. In DT, we evaluated how successful our Titanic ships were. We tested the ships on water to see if they were water-tight and buoyant. We were very good at evaluating our ships and were very honest too!







Year Three

This week in Maths, we have been learning how to add and subtract lengths. We have used conversions to help us with some mixed unit measurements and answer questions. We have also used metre sticks to measure the length of our classroom and other practical activities.

In English, we have started learning from our new class text 'Wolves in the Walls'. We have read some of the text and have identified the character's feelings and explored their emotions. We have also learnt about expanded noun phrases and have written our own sentences.

In Science, we have started learning about rocks. We have learnt about the different types of rocks and how they are formed. We have also learnt about properties of rocks and have classified rocks based on their properties. In PSCHE, we have learnt about rules within our communities and why we have rules in place and have identified existing

rules in communities we attend. In PE, we have used some of the skills we have been taught to play small sided matches in Handball. In Tennis, we have been learning how to use appropriate force to get the ball over the tennis net. In Art, we have been learning how to draw using observational techniques.

Year Four

We have continued to read the book 'Cloud Busting' during our English lessons this week. We have written our persuasive letters to Sam, persuading him not to bully Davey. We have structured our writing into paragraphs and used these to elaborate on each point that we have made, which focuses on the negative impact of bullying on everyone involved.

During our maths lessons this week, we have finished off our work on fractions. We have been calculating a fraction of a number, first by using a bar model with counters, then by using our times tables facts to help us. We have then used this knowledge to help solve problems with fractions.

We have started our science unit this week: 'Sound and Electricity'. We have started by looking at what a sound is and how a sound is produced. We have carried out a sound hunt around the school to listen for different sounds, and found out what happens in the ear in order for us to hear. During our PSHE lessons, we have found out how to help someone who has a burn. In our Spanish lessons, we have been using descriptive words and phrases to describe ourselves and others!

Year Five

In English, we have been celebrating Shakespeare Week 2022 by exploring his most famous tragedy, 'Romeo and Juliet'. On Monday, we participated in the BBC's live history lesson where we discovered many fascinating facts about William Shakespeare. After listening to a summary of the play, we practised performing quotes from the original text, sequenced the main events of the plot and enjoyed choosing scenes to recreate in drama freeze frames. We have also worked very hard in groups to produce and record a news report of one of the main events. We have taken on the role of an anchor news presenter in the studio, a journalist at the scene or an eye-witness. In Spelling lessons, we have been thinking of top tips to help us remember how to spell more complex homophone pairs such as allowed and aloud.

In Maths, our fraction focus this week has been on adding 3 or more fractions together. We have had to apply our previous learning involving improper fractions and mixed numbers, as well as our equivalent fraction knowledge.

We began our new Science unit of work: Everything changes, where we have been able to use and build on our knowledge of puberty and other human life cycle stages. We found out about gestation periods in some mammals, compared ourselves as humans to other animals and made a prediction based on the patterns we identified. We included as many animal poses as possible in our mindful yoga sequence. Please ask us about cow, cat, rabbit, cobra, crocodile and downward dog!

Year Six

This week in Year 6, we have been completing our writing based on 'What have The Maya ever done for us?' We thought carefully about the structure of our three paragraphs which detail the main inventions or discoveries of the Maya. We started each one with a clear topic sentence and tried our best to use alternative nouns for The Maya such as ancient civilisation and Mesoamerican people. We then wrote conclusions where we summarised the main points. To finish our work, we edited it for improvement and proof-read it for spelling and punctuation errors. Hopefully we will be able to publish some of our writing on the school website.

In Maths, our learning has continued to be focused upon algebra. We started the week by solving simple one-step equations involving all four operations. We were then able to progress to solving two step operations eg 4b + 2 = 20. We have also been using our knowledge of substitution to consider what possible values a pair of variables could be. This week we have started a new Science unit called 'Darwin's Discoveries' which focuses on evolution and inheritance. We looked at some of the vocabulary associated to this unit and wrote what we thought these words meant. We will revisit them at the end of the unit. We have looked at inherited and acquired characteristics and thought about our own characteristics and who we inherited them from. We have also begun to explore adaptation, looking at different animals and plants and consider how they have adapted to their environment.

In PSHE, we have been discussing how we decided what films to watch on TV, DVD or online. In Computing we have been exploring the landscaping tools in Kodu and using them to create our own world. In RE this week, we have considered the question 'Why does it matter how we treat the world?' We linked this to the various creation stories we have heard so far as well as the Buddhist theory and the Bini Benin creation story. This week in class, we have been enjoying the music of McFly.
