2020-21

The Aim of this Policy

AIM: To continue to provide an ambitious and broad curriculum in all subjects at Loudwater Combined School. This policy is primarily concerned where face-to-face sessions cannot be facilitated at school either as a result of the following:

- A pupil self-isolating
- A member of staff self-isolating
- A partial school closure due to COVID 19
- A full school closure due to COVID 19
- A local lockdown
- A national lockdown

Our Approach

The approach that will be taken from the end of September 2020 is outlined below.

This will ensure that we teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school. It may be the case that if a child is required to self-isolate the level of notice that can be given that this is about to happen will mean that the work they are set initially may not be the same as their class. However within 2 school days we will ensure that the learning they are engaged in at home mirrors that of those in school.

In Foundation stage and Key Stage 1 the work the children are set each day will be for 3 hours, in Key Stage 2 the work set will be for 4 hours.

Remote Learning Platform

We will be using Google Classroom to facilitate our remote learning. The pupil logins for this are the same as those they use when using computers in school. Passwords have been emailed to parents. If there are uncertainties about how to get started we have produced a short video to help with this. It can be found on the school website:

Access to devices

We recognise that some children may not have access to appropriate devices or online access at home. We will issue laptops to those pupils who do not have access at home. We will do this by

utilising the school allocation of laptops from the government and allocating these to pupils who are eligible for free school meals. However our allocation is not sufficient to enable all such children to have a laptop. We will lend existing school laptops and make use of any other local initiatives to address need.

We will ensure that paper copies of all worksheet s are available to those parents who request them. These will be available on a weekly basis and completed worksheet can be returned to school when collecting the next week's work.

How will children be taught remotely?

There will be a range of different approaches used to take account of the ages of pupils and the level of online access some pupils will have.

These are some examples:

- Live teaching online lessons
- Recorded teaching (eg. Oak National Academy, recordings made by teachers)
- Worksheets provided by teachers
- Work books and practice books that will be provided by school
- Commercially available websites which support the teaching of specific subjects or areas including video clips
- Some project work for example in Design Technology

Engagement and Feedback

We have provided timetables that detail the activities we would expect pupils to engage in during the school day. These are suggested timetables in that the activities do not need to be completed in the order they are on the timetable, but should ideally be completed at some point during the day. If your child is unable to complete an activity, please let the class teacher know by messaging on e-schools or using the private messaging on Google Classroom, so that we can offer support and further guidance.

In order that children do not fall behind their peers it is important that they engage in as many of the remote learning activities as possible. If class teachers have concerns about a child's engagement or progress they will contact parents promptly to discuss this.

All work submitted within the week set will be responded to by class teachers. English and Maths activities will be checked daily and feedback given. Feedback may be verbal feedback given in live feedback sessions or it could be a private message via Google Classroom.

Additional support for pupils with particular needs

We recognise that some pupils, for example some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home. We acknowledge the difficulties this may place on families, and we will work with parents and carers to support these pupils in the following ways:

- The work set for some pupils may be different to that which the majority of the class are engaged in so that children can make progress at their own pace.
- There may be some additional live sessions to provide specific support or programmes on an individual or small group basis.

• Members of school staff may make additional phone calls to such parents to check in and make sure the well-being of children and carers is supported as appropriate.

The table below shows the steps we are taking or have taken to ensure that remote learning is effective for those unable to attend school. We recognise that this may be for a variety of reasons and have detailed our approach in a number of different scenarios. These include where individual pupils need to self-isolate or shield, where a year group or bubble needs to isolate or where there is a local or national lockdown.

Loudwater Combined School Staff and Pupils Self Isolation Guidelines

We have had a number of staff self-isolate since March this year. However, most self-isolations took place while we were in lock down and working on a staff rota basis. Now that we are back at school, self-isolation of staff members and pupils poses a very different challenge for our school. There may also be additional challenged posed by the introduction of lateral flow tests, there is additional information available for staff on this topic.

Staff Members

Self-Isolation:

Staff members who are self-isolating because they have been contacted by track and trace, have a member of their household who has symptoms or potentially has been sent home from school because of a positive case of COVID in their bubble will still be paid in full by the school.

If a member of staff becomes ill during this time, they will need to let the school know of this change in circumstance, as we would need to record that as a sickness absence.

Working from Home:

If you are self-isolating you will be classed as working from home. Working from home for some staff can be problematic because of their role. Your line manager will contact you with clear information on the work they would like you to complete while at home. Again this will be different for staff across the school due to their roles. You may also be asked to carry out admin duties that you are not normally responsible for, but under the circumstances, providing effective tasks is important.

If you are a teaching member of staff, we may ask you to teach your class via Google classroom, while a covering member of staff monitors the class.

In the event that a whole year group is sent home, remote teaching will take place in line with the school timetable as per the Remote Teaching Plan.

All members of staff can remotely access their Google accounts on any computer. You can edit and create all files online without saving to your computer at all. This ensures that any offsite work for members of staff without a school laptop, is GDPR compliant.

If you develop symptoms of COVID 19, you must contact the school and inform us of your change in circumstance. If you have symptoms of COVID 19, you are ill, even if it is not COVID. In this case you should apply to have a COVID test via the Referral Portal. If you have symptoms, you will no longer be classed as working from home and will have your absence amended to sickness. In this situation, you would not be expected to complete any work for school or deliver any live lessons.

Pupils

Self-Isolation:

Pupils who are self-isolating are coded as C other circumstances, until the point they display symptom, where they should be coded as ill.

Pupils who are self-isolating should be provided with work to complete. There are work packs available for pupils that will be on Google classroom and will be updated regularly to ensure they are keeping pace with the work in class. Primary maths will be more targeted as the programme of study is highly targeted in class.

If a pupil develops symptoms, they should be considered sick and not be included in live lessons. Teachers will need to ensure they are caught up on returning to school.

There is a novelty to all of this, but if we are to ensure our pupils do not fall further behind and that staff are financially supported, while following the self-isolations guidelines, this will need to rapidly become our new way of working during this period of COVID 19.
