News from the classes this week:

## **Foundation Stage**

In Foundation Stage we have all done really well, although we are guite tired, as we have been staying all day this week. We have been listening to the story of the resourceful Little Red Hen. We have been retelling the story and ordering it chronologically. We have been counting and recognising numbers and we have been learning to write them. We put on our wellies on Tuesday and went on an autumn walk. We collected lots of leaves and have been counting and sorting them. We have had our first phonics lessons this week and have learnt the sounds s, a, t, and p. You can build quite a few words with these sounds!

# Year One

In English Year 1 has been enjoying The Gruffalo. We worked well together to sequence the story. We also sorted the characters that we would find in The Gruffalo. As a class we collected lots of super adjectives to describe the Gruffalo. We then wrote our own descriptions using some of these adjectives. In Maths this week the focus has been on subtraction. We have used cubes, pictures and number lines to help us. We have also been busy solving worded subtraction problems. It has been a very busy week in topic. On Monday we had a visit from Claire at Tesco. She talked to us about healthy eating and then we had a chance to taste a 'rainbow' of fruit and vegetables. We learnt a busy body song and labelled the external parts of the body. We also listened very carefully to our internet safety assembly.

# Year Two

This week Year 2 has been continuing to enjoy the story of George's Marvellous Medicine. We have written a diary as Grandma, created a senses poem about the medicine, written a letter as George and chosen our own genre in our Smart Write activity. In Phonics, we have continued to learn the rules for adding suffixes in order to aid their spelling. In Maths, Year 2 has been using place value knowledge to add 2-digit numbers to a single digit number, observing the changes to the tens when the units bridge 10. In Topic, we have begun learning about The Great Fire of London. We have sequenced events of the fire and retold the story through captioned pictures.

### Year Three

In English this week, Year 3 has been looking at and understanding the features of calligrams. We had a look at a variety of poems by Robert McGough and Gina Dowthwaite before planning and writing our very own shape poem on a volcano. We worked particularly hard finding powerful adjectives and synonyms to put into our poems and experimented with different sizes and fonts of writing. In Maths this week, Year 3 started the week measuring and estimating the length of objects in cm and mm. We have used our understanding of place value and number to solve problems and have used Base 10 to recognise the value of each digit in a 3 digit number. Towards the end of the week we started to read and write numbers up to 500 in numerals and in words. In Topic this week, we have been using the Learnpads and Laptops to research information on different volcanoes. ### Year Four

In English this week Year 4 has been writing a class version of a Just So Story called How The Cheetah Got His Spots. We have been focusing on using a range of powerful verbs and adverbs to develop the characters in our story. We are now also thinking of ideas to use to write our very own Just So Story next week. During maths we have been learning mental and formal written methods of addition using four digit numbers. This has included when each method would be appropriate to use, and solving problems using the different methods of addition. Topic work has seen us start to look at habitats around school and how to classify animals based upon their features.

### Year Five

This week in English, Year 5 has been continuing to read Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We have now met the other children who win golden tickets and have written fantastic character descriptions of Augustus Gloop. We have also been working on different descriptive devices to improve our writing. In maths Year Five has been focusing on decimal place value. We have converted ordered and compared decimal fractions and have been exploring the relationship between tenths and hundredths. In topic lessons Year 5 has finished writing up our melting investigation and has been learning about reversible and irreversible changes. We have also found out what happens when vinegar and bicarbonate and soda are mixed!

### Year Six

In English this week, we have been performing our play scripts 'The Great Mouse Plot'. We have also been writing the version of events from Mrs Pratchett's or Thwaites' point of view. We have read how Roald Dahl spent all of his summer holidays in Norway so we have been researching why visitors might want to go to Norway and have created persuasive advertisements. In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages. Our activities have included: converting percentages into decimal and fractions and vice versa and applying these skills to problem solving and reasoning questions. In Topic, we have visited the Rye and explored the different facilities available to visitors. We have then written a report detailing the facilities and how they could possibly be improved.
