News from the classes this week:

#### Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have found a lot of food missing! We think that maybe the Tiger who came to Tea has eaten all our food, but now he has disappeared so we can't ask him. We have made Wanted posters, describing the tiger and hope that someone may have seen him and can get him back to us so that we can sort the mystery out. We have made lots of "Tiger Food" so we will be able to give him a decent meal if he is still hungry! We have used our sketch books to draw some of the plastic tigers and other wild animals that we have in our classroom.

In Maths we have been finding the number that is one more than a given number and looking at numbers on a number line.

# Year One

English – Year 1 have loved the story 'Aaargh Spider!' by Lydia Monks. We read the story in pairs and as a whole class. We loved the sparkly illustrations and we also found out why there are so many exclamation marks in the book. Spiders then became the theme for the rest of the week. We found out lots of information by reading books and watching video clips. Year 1 then wrote some amazing spider information and also labelled pictures. It was lovely to hear that some children had even been researching spiders at home! Maths – A busy 2d shape week! We have been naming shapes and describing their properties. We found 2d shapes around our school and made our own super shape pictures. We also sorted shapes and labelled the ways that we had sorted them. Another busy and fun week!

Topic – On a very chilly afternoon we went for a walk around our outdoor area to look at seasonal changes. There were lots! The trees looked very different, except the evergreen ones! We talked about the difference in the weather and also the fact that some animals were now busy hibernating.

# Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been continuing to enjoy the story of 'Dogger' by Shirley Hughes. We have planned and written our own narrative story about a lost toy. We are

learning how to structure stories and how to edit our writing once we have finished. In Phonics, we are learning the w special rule. When the sound is 'o' after a 'w' sound, then the spelling is 'a' e.g. was, want, squash. In Maths, we have been learning to add two 2digit numbers using partitioning and the empty number line. There are still some children having difficulty adding 10 to a 2-digit number. This would be a good area to focus on at home. Call out any 2-digit number and ask your child to respond with the number that is 10 more. This recall needs to be done speedily!!! In Topic, we have been learning about different materials and their properties e.g. why is fabric a good material for Teddy? Why do you think coins are made of metal? Etc. Also, this week, we enjoyed a trip to Barrowcroft to share songs and our learning with the elderly residents. This was a very positive experience for us all!

# Year Three

We have linked our Topic of the Romans to our English this week. On Monday we described what Roman soldiers used to wear. We then started talking about what life was like in Roman times – especially the conditions if you were building Hadrian's Wall. Towards the end of the week we wrote letters to Emperor Hadrian about these conditions. In Maths this week we have been looking at ways to multiply and divide by 8. The children have completed Bar Modelling, Arrays and have seen questions in different representations. Towards the end of the week, they looked at applying their understanding of their tables to problem solving and reasoning questions as well as completing a game to end the block. In Topic we have planned and written our own chronological report on the Romans. We particularly focused on Hadrian's Wall, Roman armies and Gods that they worshiped. The children used their Home Learning to help them write this week – next week, we will be looking at Gladiators!

#### Year Four

In English this week, we have continued to write the next chapter in the story 'The Firework-maker's Daughter'. We have written the different parts of the chapter including the opening, build-up, action and resolution. We then edited and improved our writing before publishing our work into neat.

In maths this week we have looked at written methods of multiplication. We have found out how to multiply a two digit number by a one digit number, first using place value counters and the grid method, before moving onto the expanded written method. We have also looked at solving two-step word problems involving addition and multiplication. During our topic lessons, we have continued to focus on the topic of sound. We have found out how sound travels to the ear and found out what happens inside the ear that allows us to hear. We have also carried out an investigation into the pitch of a sound, and found patterns between pitch and the object that has created the sound.

#### Year Five

This week in English, Year Five have been looking at the short animation 'The Piano' by Aiden Gibbons. They have started to explore the character of the old man, and have written some excellent setting descriptions of the piano at the beginning of the film. They are now starting to explore the use of flashbacks in narrative writing.

In Maths, Year Five have been continuing their work on multiplication and division. They have been working hard to use the formal written methods of column multiplication and short division to answer calculations, and deciding when this would be the best method to use. They have also been using the inverse operation to check their answers.

In Topic lessons, Year Five really enjoyed a visit from John Gurney from the Loudwater and Flackwell Heath History Group. They found out about the role of Loudwater and the local area in World War Two, and some about some of the super secret operations going on! They have also started researching the D Day Landings and have been doing some map work to find the locations of the beaches in Normandy and the ports where the fleets left Britain. https://www.iwm.org.uk/history/what-you-need-to-know-about-ve-day

### Year Six

In English this week we have been completing our non-chronological reports on the planet of Pandora. Our report has focused upon the features of the planet and one of the creatures that lives there, its diet, habitat and life cycle. Our grammar focus has been parenthesis and the use of commas to separate clauses. Our spelling focus this week has been words with the letter string 'ough'. In Maths, we have been reviewing and consolidating our learning on long multiplication, division and mental strategies. We have also revised our understanding of the area of rectilinear shapes. In Topic we have been observing and recording phenomena related to light and how we see. On Wednesday, eight of the class represented the school at the Mini-Enterprise competition at Cressex School. A very enjoyable evening was had by all.
