News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have been learning about bones. We have heard more "Funnybones" stories and have met Simon the Skeleton. Unfortunately he has been "borrowing" the bones that we have been counting, and we have had to go on a bone hunt and re-order the bones on our number line. We have also made Funnybones music and made play dough bones. We have drawn skeletons on black paper with chalk and we have labelled pictures of our bodies and of the skeleton. www.phonicsplay.co.uk/Phase2Menu.htm

Year One

We have had great fun in English this week! As a class we made a list to explain what we would need if we had a rumpus like max and the wild things. We also wrote an invitation asking our friends if they would like to come to a rumpus. Following instructions has also been a focus this week. We had to follow instructions to make jelly and jam sandwiches. We also had to order these instructions. In maths it has been a busy week subtracting! We have been using practical apparatus, pictures and number lines to help us subtract. We also solved some subtraction problems. This week, in topic, we have been learning more about the artist Pablo Picasso. We looked at more of his abstract portraits and then created our own abstract portraits of our family and friends. Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been continuing our learning about 'The Great Fire of London'. We have written the remaining chapters of our information text and added a front cover and blurb. We have also included a contents page! In Phonics, we have begun to learn the rules for adding suffixes beginning with a consonant such as -ful, -less and -ly. In Maths, we have begun to use our knowledge of number bonds to explore addition and subtraction facts. For example, if you know 12 + 8 = 20, you also know 8 + 12 = 20, 20 - 8 = 12 and 20 - 12 = 8. In addition to our in school learning, we had a very educational

and enjoyable day at Wycombe Museum, learning about toys dating back to the Victorian era. The lady at the museum was very complimentary about the manners of the children and their super knowledge! Well done Year 2! https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/articles/z8hyfrd

Year Three

In English this week we have been writing reports about Mount Vesuvius. We discussed and planned our writing at the beginning of the week, leading to some excellent, imaginative writing to end. In Maths, we have been looking at adding 3 digit numbers using the extended column method. To start the week we looked at exchanging using place value counters and then moved onto more formal methods. In Topic, we have been learning about the differences between Northern and Southern Italy. We have also been labelling places in Italy using atlases. Towards the end of the week, we completed an investigation on different types of rocks.

Year Four

In English this week, Year Four has been writing non-chronological reports about our own invented creatures in the style of Arthur Spiderwick. We have edited, improved and published these as 'Year Four's Field Guide to the Fantastical World Around You'. In maths this week, we have been developing our understanding of the formal written methods for addition and subtraction, through concrete and pictorial representations. We have started to apply this knowledge to problem solving and reasoning tasks. In topic lessons, Year Four has been learning about the effects of deforestation and the devastating impact this has on the world's rainforests. We have also created persuasive information leaflets, in order to make others aware of this issue.

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five has been looking at different people's experiences of being evacuated. We have read and analysed different letters and have now written our own letters home, imagining that we have been sent away to the countryside. In maths, we have been continuing to use mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. We have been applying these skills to solve problems with more than one step, missing numbers, and using the inverse operation. In topic lessons, we have been practising some World War Two songs which we will perform at the end of November at Wright's Meadow Community Centre. We have also been learning about the scientific process of dissolving, and have investigated the solubility of different substances.

Year Six

In English this week we have created advertisements to persuade people to visit Norway. We have used stunning images of the landscape and a range of rhetorical devices to convince readers that it is the best place to visit. We have also started to develop our own autobiographical story inspired by Roald Dahl. In our Grammar sessions, we have been learning about the use of pronouns and have been consolidating our understanding of speech punctuation. Our spelling focus has been words with a 'shul' sound, spelt -tial. In Maths, we have been using the formal written method of long multiplication to solve calculations with up to 4 digits multiplied by a two digit number. We have also been developing our use of different mental strategies when solving multiplication and division calculations involving lager numbers eg 101 x 30 and 5600 \div 80. In Topic, we have been how light travels.

Remembrance Weeks: History Workshop and Remembrance Service

As part of our History curriculum we will be commemorating the 100th anniversary of the end of World War One during the weeks of the 29th October and 5th November. On Friday November 2nd we have arranged for the children from Year 1 to Year 6 to participate in a World War One workshop. The cost of this workshop is £3.50 per child; please visit the Gateway to make your payment.

On Friday 9th November all of the children from Foundation Stage to Year 6 will be visiting St Peter's Church to take part in the school's Remembrance Service at 9.45am. This service will commemorate the lives of the twenty-six men from Loudwater who fought in the first war and who did not return. Parents, carers and grandparents are warmly welcomed to join us for this special event. Tickets are available through Eventbrite as detailed earlier this week.

During our Remembrance Weeks the children will be making poppies which will be used in St Peter's Remembrance Service on Sunday 11th November. On the following Monday all classes will be visiting the Loudwater War Memorial to see how their poppies have been laid at the memorial. This is an activity were we will be using the Consent for Local Walks and Trips given on the Gateway.
