# News from the classes this week:

# Foundation Stage

This week we have had lots of fun in the classroom making maps for Rosie the hen and completing block charts about our favourite types of transport, but the highlight of our week has been our trip to Kew Gardens. It was our first trip out and the adults were very impressed with our great behaviour. We saw some amazing plants and trees and some beautiful glass sculptures. We had a brilliant workshop with Bella, who helped us to make a "treasure collage" from plant parts that we had found and she told us a story about a king and a queen who were given some seeds. We went on the Treetop walk, which was over 100 steps to the top and had a chance to explore lots of other areas. However, there was so much there, we felt we could go back for another day! # Year One

This week we have been linking our English and Science lessons in preparation for our trip to Kew. We looked at some of the plants that we might see and also found out the reason why we mustn't touch or pick any of them. We looked at 3 different plants and had to choose an odd one out and write the reason why it was the odd plant out. We all had some great reasons and we all used the word **because!** We also enjoyed learning about how we can identify the different plants that we will see and we wrote instructions so that other people will also know how to do this.

This week, in maths, our focus has been on learning about multiples of 5. We know that they end in 5 or 0. We counted objects in groups of 5 and we have been finding 5 more and 5 less of multiples of 5.

We had a brilliant trip to Kew and I hope the children have been telling you all about it. They were all a pleasure to take. The adults who worked at Kew were very impressed with our knowledge and behaviour. We were all very proud of them! On our trip to Kew we saw sculptures by the artist Daniel Chihuly. We were amazed to find out that all of these sculptures are made of glass. We watched a video clip to see how glass sculptures are made! We enjoyed making sculptures (not with glass!). We also loved our art lesson where they collaged plants. A very messy but fun lesson!

### Year Two

This week is Science Week. In Year 2 we have been reading the story of 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle. We drew a labelled map to show the journey of the seed, we wrote a narrative of the journey from the seed's point of view and we created a safety poster to help the seed to keep safe from the dangers. On Friday we wrote a recount of our trip to Kew Gardens. In Phonics we have been revising the rules for using an apostrophe for contractions. In Maths we have been using the bar model method to understand missing number sentences. We were learning how to use the inverse operation to find the missing number. In Topic we have been learning about the life cycle of a plant and the different way that seeds are dispersed. On Thursday we enjoyed a trip to Kew Gardens where we learned more about plants and their habitats.

# Year Three

In English this week we have read the next chapter of the 'Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. We have acted out events that have happened so far using props to help us engage our audience. We have planned and written our own newspaper reports about the Iron Man emerging out of the ground and finding old tractors and lorries to eat at the nearby farms.

In Maths, we have been focussing on money. We started the week looking at the value of the different coins and notes that we use. We then went on to add and subtract amounts of money in pounds and pence using the methods that we know. Towards the end of the week, we looked at giving and receiving change.

In Topic this week we have discussed how magnets are used in everyday life, from computers to Maglev trains. We have also looked at the different forces in movement and sports. We had a fantastic trip to Kew Gardens and saw lots of amazing things. Our workshop was brilliant and everyone had a great time. We will be using Marianne North, a botanical artist as inspiration for our own art work next week.

# Year Four

In English this week, we have continued to read the book 'Why the Whales Came'. We have found out more information about The Birdman and written character descriptions for him in which we tried to infer what it must be like for him as a victimised character. We then planned the next chapter in the story, in which Gracie and Daniel are lost on Samson Island. In our maths lessons, we have been interpreting data presented in different ways including tables, bar charts, pictograms and line graphs. We have solved comparison, sum and difference problems using these charts and drawn our own charts using data we have collected.

In our topic lessons we have focused on plants. First we explored the question - how can you tell if something is a plant? We used what we know about plants to design and carry out an investigation. We have also looked at identifying a number of trees by their leaves, and creating a classification key to help us with this.

#### Year Five

This week Year Five have been enjoying Science Week. We have learned about the carbon cycle and how trees absorb carbon dioxide from our atmosphere and then store it as carbon. We investigated how much carbon was stored in the trees in the school grounds, then looked at the effects of burning fossil fuels and climate change. We have also started to look at the next step in the life cycle of flowering plants: seed dispersal. We have discussed different methods of seed dispersal and have started an investigation to find the most effective helicopter style seed. We really enjoyed our rivers workshop from the Chiltern Conservation Board on Wednesday. During our river sweeping, we managed to catch a variety of small fish and invertebrates including bullhead fish, mayfly nymphs, shrimp and leeches! we created observational drawings of these, investigated how much of the world's water is used in rivers and found out some different ways to save water as 52% of our chalk streams are currently in drought! It was a really enjoyable and informative day.

This week, we have started to rehearse our leaver's production, 'Olivia'. We have been reading through the lines and have begun to practice the songs. In Maths, we have continued working on our theme park investigations. Working in small groups, we have had to calculate all the profits and expenditure that our theme park has incurred including taxes and insurance. In Topic, we have started to decorate our Mayan masks which we made last Monday using papier-mâché and balloons. We have also researched and found our own names in Mayan glyphs and have recreated them on paper. On Friday, we enjoyed an amazing trip to Kew Garden. We all experienced a fantastic workshop on evolution and adaptation and had the opportunity to explore the Palm House and Temperate House.
