In maths it has been another busy fractions week! The focus this week has been on finding a quarter of an object and a quarter of an amount of sweets. In topic we have been thinking about all of the things we have enjoyed learning this half term. Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been continuing to enjoy 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. We have written a diary entry as one of the seagulls, created a Cinquain poem about a Lighthouse and completed a Smart Write activity about Lighthouses and the seaside. In Maths we have been learning to identify clockwise and anti-clockwise turns. We have also explored quarter, half, three-quarter and whole turns in both directions. In Topic we explored how to create pictures of transport to give the illusion that they are moving! We also had our last swimming session for this year, a final Rounders match with Usports and a wonderful music concert at St. Peter's Church. Year Three

This week in English, we have been reading and discussing lots of different Aesop's fables along with the morals that they teach. At the beginning of the week we looked at planning our very own fable using our school values to help us. After we planned the morals we wanted to demonstrate to our audience, we wrote independently and shared our writing with the rest of the class. In Maths this week we have been looking at fractions involving number. We started off by talking about what fractions were and key vocabulary such as 'numerator' and 'denominator.' We then looked at adding and subtracting fractions as well as comparing them using inequality brackets and the concrete apparatus to help us. In Topic this week we have been discussing all about our ancestors. We enthusiastically completed our home learning and discussed our family roots with the rest of the class!

Year Four

This week in English, we have continued to focus on the animation 'The Windmill Farmer'. At the start of the week we performed some drama linked to the animation, we worked in groups to create six freeze frames to show the main parts of the story. Using this, we were then able to plan and write a narrative to go with the story. Our narratives included descriptive language, and speech to show the farmer's thoughts and feelings during his ordeal. In maths this week, we have had a focus on finding the area of shapes. We have discussed what is meant by the term area and found the area of different shapes on a grid by counting the number of squares their surface takes up. Later on in the week, we investigated different ways to draw shapes with the same area. In our topic lessons we have found out about the ancient Egyptian pyramids. We completed research into how they were made and the reasons behind this, and found out lots of interesting facts.

In maths, Year Five has completed their final arithmetic assessment of the year. In addition to this, we have investigated the volume of different rocks through water displacement and have been revising our maths and problem solving skills in our summer themed maths activity packs.

We really enjoyed our visit to Hughenden Manor on Thursday. We learned about the role of Hillside during the war, experienced map making, code breaking, and made our own ration books and identity cards.
