News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have been learning about pandas and black bears, and we look forward to sharing some of the facts we have found out with everyone in our class assembly next Thursday. We have also read a story about a bear who lost his hat and wanted to get it back. We have used this story as a frame to write our own stories about a cow who has lost her bag.

In Maths, we have been trying to solve an argument between some of the bears in our class. They can't work out who is the tallest and so we have been measuring them to help them work it out.

Year One

The focus for our English and topic work this week has been our trip to Tiggywinkles. We wrote rules that we needed to follow and used some super imperative verbs...the most important one being ENJOY!

On Thursday we wrote some super recounts of our day. We had a brilliant trip and learnt so much. The children were a delight to take. There are some photos of the day on our e-schools page.

We have also been having fun with fractions in Maths. We have been finding halves of cakes, shapes and amounts of sweets.

Year Two

This week we have explored the life of Anne Fine, who is the author of 'The Diary of a Killer Cat'. We researched her life and made notes, organising the facts into sub-

headings: Early Life, Accomplishments, Personal Information and Interesting Facts. Then we wrote a biography of Anne Fine, structuring our text with sub-headings, detailed sentences, noun-phrases and conjunctions to create a text to be enjoyed by others. We also wrote a book review of 'The Diary of a Killer Cat'. We were interested to find out that Anne Fine hates cats! Finally, we completed a Smart Write activity where we were able to choose our own style of writing based on Tuffy, the Killer Cat. In Topic we designed, made and evaluated a clay sculpture of Tuffy the cat. We had to decide how we wanted our audience to view Tuffy. Would he be vicious, peaceful or sneaky? Then we moulded the clay to create his body shape, adding features using tools. All models were super! In Maths we have been revisiting addition using the partitioning method. This time we have been adding amounts of money, learning how to write totals that are bigger than $100 \ (£1.00)$. In Phonics we have been revisiting the use of suffixes and how they change the meaning of a root word and which rule we need to apply.

Year Three

This week in English we have continued to read 'Wolves in the Walls'. We have found out that the wolves aren't scary after all, they just have very bad manners; eating jam on toast and popcorn along with throwing house parties! We have used this text to write setting descriptions and writing from different perspectives. We have discussed how the author builds tension for us as readers along with the purposeful language that he uses. In Maths this week we have been using concrete resources (place value counters) to help us multiply a 2 digit number by a single digit number. We then moved onto formal methods of multiplication - using the grid method to help us with this. We are now looking at dividing a 2 digit number by a single digit number.

In Topic this week we have been learning about germs! We have discussed viruses, bacteria and fungi. We understand that some microorganisms are helpful, yet others can be very harmful. We conducted an investigation with glitter to see how far it spread around the classroom throughout the duration of an afternoon by placing a spoonful in someone's hands. It is safe to say that at the end of the day - the glitter was everywhere!

Year Four

In our English lesson this week, we have been writing non-chronological reports about the Oompa-Loompas that work in Mr Willy Wonka's factory. We have found information from the story and organised this into different paragraphs before writing, editing and publishing our reports. During our maths lessons, we have learnt how to represent tenths and hundredths as decimals and fractions. We have used place value grids to

represent the fractions as decimals and looked at the effect of dividing one and two digit numbers by 100. In our topic lessons this week, we have learnt about the process of evaporation. We have discussed where we might see evaporation in everyday life such as water drying in a puddle or clothes hanging on a washing line. We have also looked at the water cycle and described the different process that take place during this. https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/articles/z3wpp39

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five have been planning and writing newspaper articles about the death of Bess and The Highwayman. We have had to think carefully about the structure of our reports, the type of language we need to use, and how to adapt our writing for audience and purpose.

In maths, we have been continuing to practise the formal written method for long multiplication. We have had to think carefully about the order in which we multiply the numbers, and using a place holding zero. We have also been using the short written method for multiplication. We practised exchanging when using this method with place value counters and are now applying these skills in problem solving work. We are starting to interpret remainders as fractions and decimals.

On Wednesday afternoon, we enjoyed working on the Mead with the Chiltern Rangers. We planted hundreds of plug plants which will form a new wild flower meadow, and helped with wood-chipping the footpath. In our topic lessons, we have started to think about the effects of friction on our landing capsules and will investigate how friction affects different surfaces next week.

Year Six

In English this week we have been planning and writing exciting 'rescue' stories inspired by our trip to Hazard Alley. We each chose one of the scenarios that we experienced as the basis to our stories, which had to follow the advice given to us by the instructors. For example if our stories involved a water rescue then we know that we should not enter the water. Instead we would find a lifebuoy or an object that would float to throw to the person in difficult. Our stories also had to include a telephone call to the emergency services. Our spelling focus this week has been silent letters. In Maths we have been consolidating our understanding of: drawing and translating simple shapes on the coordinate plane; using angle facts to find missing angles; calculating the perimeter of compound shapes and finding the area of rectangles. In Topic we have been creating a timeline to develop our understanding of the Stone Age. Although prehistoric people are often thought of as not being very clever, we discovered that they actually completed some great achievements, such as creating fire and making sharp wooden and stone tools. We used a 'Diamond Nine' activity to discuss how the achievements could have improved people's lives. On Wednesday afternoon, we had a great time on Kingsmead helping the Chiltern Rangers. We laid bark on the pathway and planted plants in the wet and dry areas.
