### Value of the month

The value of the month for April is Kindness and the inspirational person we will be exploring the life of is Tanni Grey Thompson.

During assemblies and PSCHE lessons children will be exploring and discussing the following questions:

- How have you been kind to someone recently?
- When do your friends need your kindness?
- What are your responsibilities if you think someone is being bullied?

One of our whole school assemblies will include a story about a child who has been bullied and how they overcame this. We want to encourage the children to think about their responsibilities in supporting their friends should they find themselves in such a situation.

News from the classes this week:

### **Foundation Stage**

This week Foundation Stage has been investigating a crime that has been committed in our school playground!! We are still piecing together our ideas, but here are some of the clues we have observed:

- Our role play area has an address on the door, it is Number Three, Wood Lane.
- We have seen a chair that is broken and a bed sheet hanging out of the window.
- There is a small bowl and a ribbon on the floor and there is a medium sized bowl and a big bowl on the table.
- There is some stuff sprinkled around. We thought it was chicken or rabbit food, and one person thought it was cat litter, but when we read the label on the half empty packet we found out it was porridge oats.

What could have happened?

We are writing reports to help the Police with their inquiries and once the problem has been solved we will start the clean-up operation! We will let you know as the facts become clearer.

### Year One

In English we have had a fun week reading different versions of the 3 little pigs. We also worked in pairs to sequence pictures from the story and retell it to each other. We have written some super sentences to match the pictures that we had sequenced. This week our Maths lessons have been very practical. We have bene using balance scales, kitchen scales and 1 kg weights to find the weight of objects. We have had great fun finding the capacity of lots of different containers. We were lucky with the weather as we did our investigating outside with plenty of water! We now know that capacity is measured in I and ml and that the weight of objects can be measured in g and kg.

We were excited to learn that our new topic is all about buildings. We all drew the buildings that we live in. We learnt about the different types of homes that we live in and also found out about the features these homes have. We made a bar chart to show how many children live in each type of home. We found out that nobody in our class lives in a castle like the Queen!

As a class we raised a total of £255 for the hearing dogs - a great big thank you for your support with this.

### **Year Two**

This week Year 2 has been enjoying the story of 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark'. They have written a character description of Plop, a letter to Plop to tell him how they feel about the dark, a senses poem about the dark and instructions on how to be a night bird. In Maths, they have been using number bonds to help them to add 2 digit and single digit numbers. They have also been learning how to read scales and record measurements, including temperatures. In Topic, they have planted tomato seeds and looked in the outdoor environment for objects that are alive, not alive and never been alive. ### **Year Three**

This week in English, Year 3 has started a new text called Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman. They started off the week by using a range of sources to gather information on wolves. They have discussed what the story might be about and have written their own predictions; taking information from just the blurb and the picture on the front cover of the book. In Maths the children have worked on identifying, representing and comparing numbers to 1000. They have also looked at counting forwards and backwards in tenths as well as

understanding that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts. Towards the end of the week they interpreted data using bar charts and pictograms. We have started our new Topic on Shaping Up for this side of the term. The children have had the opportunity to read and discuss their new targets and have drawn title pages to represent these in their books. They all participated in a 'human body' treasure hunt that consisted of 30 questions being scattered around the school to find and solve in small groups. Next week we will be learning all about muscles and bones.

### **Year Four**

This week in English, Year 4 has written a recount about one event they participated in during the Easter holidays. We have started to read the book Coraline by Neil Gaiman; the children have been identifying the characteristics of the individuals introduced so far using the text to support their ideas. In Mathematics we have been using formal (column) methods to add and subtract four digit numbers including decimals. The children have used this skill to solve problems involving money. Our new topic is called 'Bright Sparks' and the children have started to identify appliances that run on electricity and have considered which statements about the topic are true or false.

### **Year Five**

This week in English, Year Five has started a new book called, Gangsta Granny, by David Walliams which we are all really enjoying – it's very funny and sometimes a little bit rude! We have written character descriptions about Granny and are talking about the character of Ben so that we can write a letter to an agony aunt as him. In Maths we have been revising partitioning, place value and decimal numbers to 3 decimal places. We have started a new unit about measures and this will include converting measures, different types of graphs and reading scales. Our new topic is called; existing endangered, extinct. ### Year Six

In English this week, Year 6 has written stories inspired by their trip to Hazard Alley Safety Centre. They have based their stories on one of the scenarios that they encountered on the day. They have written about becoming heroes when they have rescued someone or saved a person in difficulties and they had to take control of a situation or event and telephone for the emergency services. In grammar they have been revising determiners, synonyms and antonyms. In Maths, Year 6 has been revising the properties of 2d and 3d shapes, drawing and measuring angles with a protractor, constructing and interpreting line graphs and pie charts. They have continued to work hard on their arithmetic skills. In Topic, Year 6 has started their new topic called Investigators.
