News from the classes this week:

#### **Foundation Stage**

In Foundation Stage this week we have listened to the story of 'Funnybones'. We have used this story to help us learn about bones. We have labelled a skeleton, and learnt about how our bones help us to stand up and move, and how they help to protect delicate parts of our bodies. We have made Funnybones pictures which helped us practise our cutting skills. At Number time we have been counting up AND back down from 20 and learning to recognise and write our numbers. #### Year One

'Where the wild things are' by Maurice Sendak has been our focus text in English this week and we have all loved it! We enjoyed listening to the story and discussing it. We especially enjoyed making a list and writing about all of the mischief that Max caused! We made a collection of brilliant adjectives to describe the wild things and talked about the words that we wouldn't use and the reasons why. The children also write some super sentences about the wild things. We are looking forward to finding out even more about this book next week. It has been another busy adding up week in maths! This week we have been using pictures and number lines to help with our adding. We have also been busy solving addition problems. This week in topic Year 1 has been looking at how the trees around our school are changing now that autumn is properly upon us. We have enjoyed sharing some of the interesting leaves and nuts that we have brought in. We had fun collecting different fallen leaves, some evergreen and some deciduous and using these to make some super pictures which we have displayed. Some of us also made some lovely pictures at home. We have also been introduced to the artist Picasso; we have been creating our own abstract pictures which look brilliant!

#### Year Two

In Year 2, we have been continuing our learning about the events of 'The Great Fire of London'. We have been looking carefully at information books about the fire and identifying the features e.g. sub-headings, captions, labels, portraits and information sentences. We have planned our own information text about the fire and have started to write Chapters 1 and 2. These chapters are about London before the fire and how the fire started. In Topic, we have learned a range of songs about the fire: Flow, Flow, Flow, London's Burning, London Town has Fallen Down, and other songs too. In Phonics, we are learning the spelling rules when adding –er and –est to adjectives. We have also explored the rules for adding – er to verbs to create a noun e.g. run = runner and bake = baker. In Maths, we have begun a new unit of work on Addition and Subtraction. We have been focusing on being able to recall number facts to 10, 20 and 100. This is an area that the pupils can practise at home! The website below will help the children to develop swift recall of number facts, without needing to count on their fingers or in their heads. #### Year Three

This week in English we have been looking at the book, 'Everything Volcanoes and Earthquakes' (National Geographic). We started off the week by looking at different newspaper reports along with the features we could include in our own reports. In small groups, we wrote and presented our own reports to the rest of the class. Towards the end of the week, we wrote our own reports on the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. In Maths we have moved on to looking at mental and written calculation strategies. We started off the week with an engage and explore activity where we had the opportunity to discuss when and where the methods that we will be learning will come in useful. We looked at the use of rounding and bridging 10 as mental calculation strategies. We then had the opportunity to apply these to problem solving and reasoning questions towards the end of the week. In Topic, we have been continuing with our volcanoes. We did a fantastic job covering them with newspaper and glue last week and this week we have been looking to harden them using papier mache as it will be easier to paint them. The children also started some fantastic collages of volcanoes too.

#### Year Four

This week in English, Year Four has been writing non-chronological reports based on Arthur Spiderwick's Field Guide. We have had to think about the creature's appearance, habitat and behaviour, and use headings, sub headings and paragraphs to organise our writing. In maths, Year Four has been using mental methods to solve addition calculations. We have also been learning how to use the formal written methods for addition. Next week, we will be starting to use the formal written method of column subtraction. In topic lessons, we have been working hard to complete our wildlife identification guides for creatures found in the world's rainforests. We have researched facts and have used these to make and illustrate our guides.

#### **Year Five**

This week in English, Year Five has been imagining that they are the character of David from 'Friend or Foe'. We have written diary entries about our journey to Exeter, which we have later edited and improved. Additionally, we have been interviewed about what life was like on the farm! In maths, Year Five has been looking at mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. We used rounding and adjusting, sequencing and number lines in order to add and subtract numbers with up to six digits. Now we are revising the formal column algorithms for both addition and subtraction. In topic lessons, Year Five has been finishing our recounts of being caught in an air raid. 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#### Year Six

In English this week we have completed our play scripts based on the chapter 'The Great Mouse Plot' from Roald Dahl's autobiography 'Boy'. Once the scripts were finished we were able to perform them to the rest of the class in the outdoor classroom. We have also written this chapter from the point of view of Thwaites (Dahl's school friend) or Mrs Pratchett – the nasty sweet shop owner. In our Grammar sessions, we have been learning about the subject and object of a sentence and also sentences written in active and passive voice. Our spelling focus has been words with a 'shul' sound, spelt –cial. In Maths, we have been solving calculations using the rule of BIDMAS which tells us to order to complete operations – brackets, indices, division, multiplication, addition and subtraction. We have also had our first lessons on algebra where we were able to develop our understanding that the letters stand for an unknown numbers. In Topic, we have investigated how we see objects and how light travels.

#### Remembrance Weeks: History Workshop and Remembrance Service

As part of our History curriculum we will be commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War One during the weeks of the 29<sup>th</sup> October and 5<sup>th</sup> November. On Friday November 2<sup>nd</sup> we have arranged for the children from Year 1 to Year 6 to participate in a World War One workshop. The cost of this workshop is £3.50 per child; please visit the Gateway to make your payment.

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November all of the children from Foundation Stage to Year 6 will be visiting St Peter's Church to take part in the school's Remembrance Service at 9.45am. This service will commemorate the lives of the twenty-six men from Loudwater who fought in the first war and who did not return. Parents, carers and grandparents are warmly welcomed to join us for this special event. Tickets will be available through Eventbrite with further details to follow next week.

During our Remembrance Weeks the children will be making poppies which will be used in St Peter's Remembrance Service on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> November. On the following Monday all classes will be visiting the Loudwater War Memorial to see how their poppies have been laid at the memorial.
