News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have re-written the story of 'Rosie's Walk' and have been remembering our great trip to Kew Gardens. We have practiced our addition skills and been for a walk to Key Stage One.

On Wednesday we had a brilliant trip to Bekonscot. Once again the adults were delighted with our behaviour and we learnt lots about transport and travelling in the past. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/

Year One

In English this week Year 1 has been studying the Briar Rose triptych paintings by Edward Burne-Jones. We were picture detectives and had to make a list of all that they could see in these paintings. These paintings tell part of the story of Sleeping Beauty. We learnt that these paintings are now in a stately home called Buscot Park. We wrote some information about these paintings so that it could be included in a visitor's guide book. This week we have also been learning about suffixes.

In Maths this week we have continued our focus on multiples of 5. We have been counting objects in groups of 5 and finding 5 more and 5 less than any multiple of 5. We have also been writing number sentences, including multiplication ones, to match pictures and solving problems involving multiples of 5.

In topic this week we have been looking at the location and features of a castle. Next week we are hoping to build models of castles so please could you send in boxes to enable us to have plenty to build with!

Year Two

In Year 2 we have been reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda and David Armitage. We wrote a letter to Mr and Mrs Grinling, the lighthouse keepers, to advise them how to get rid of their seagull problem. Then we created a poster warning the fisherman of the sneaky seagulls. Also, we wrote a diary entry as Hamish the cat and, finally, we created a recipe for a disgusting sandwich which would scare off the seagulls. In Phonics we have been revising homophones, looking at their spelling and their definition. In Maths we have been revising fractions. We have counted in halves, found different ways of colouring ½, ¼ and ¾ of shapes, scaled numbers up and down using halving and doubling and solved worded problems involving doubling and halving. In Topic we have explored the work of Giuseppe Arcemboldo, who created paintings of human faces using fruits and vegetables to build up the face. We also sketched real life fruits, learning how to create light and shade with a pencil.

Year Three

This week in English we have been continuing with the story of 'The Iron Man.' We have read the chapter where something is coming towards Earth on a red star. We have been expert astronomers and have informed everyone what is going on by writing a newspaper article. In Maths we have been looking at different units of measurement for length. We have been converting mm, cm and m as well as adding and subtracting lengths using a variety of written and mental methods. Towards the end of the week we applied these skills to problem solving and reasoning questions.

In Topic this week, we have been designing and planning our own board game that concentrates on magnets. We have also created observational drawings using Marianne North, a 19th Century botanical artist as inspiration.

Year Four

In English this week, we have been writing the next chapter in our book 'Why the Whales Came'. We have looked at including a setting description, building up suspense and including dialogue in our writing. We will be aiming to apply all of these next week during our independent writing!

During maths we have continued to look at statistics. We have again been presenting data in bar charts and pictograms, as well as solving comparison, sum and difference problems using the data that has been presented.

During our topic lessons we have found out how Anglo-Saxon kings reacted to the Viking invasions in Britain. We have learnt about King Alfred the Great and how he made a treaty with the Vikings which led to the formation of Danelaw. We have also looked at Viking longhouses and how they were built and lived in.

Year Five

This week in English, Year 5 has been learning about using formal language. We have discussed the differences between formal and informal language and using non-standard English. We have then used this to write a report from the point of view of a character called Abu Boutros from Oranges in No Man's Land. We had to think carefully about using precise and powerful vocabulary, chronological order and adverbial phrases for time, place and manner. In maths, we have been learning about volume and capacity. We have learned what the difference between volume and capacity is, and have used cubes to build, measure and compare the volume of different solid shapes. We have also used water displacement to find the volume of irregular shapes (rocks!).

In science lessons, we have been continuing our work from Kew Gardens, learning about the different stages in the life cycles of flowering plants and seed dispersal. We have also been busy practising our values assembly about respect, and learning our line dance for the school fete!

Year Six

This week in English, we have started to read 'My Name is Mina' by David Almond. This book is a prequel to the book 'Skellig'. We have begun to explore the character of Mina. In Maths, we have continued to work on our Theme Park investigation. We have been able to develop our calculator skills in preparation for our transition to secondary school. We have also spent time this week on rehearsing our leaver's production which we are looking forward to performing on the evening of Tuesday 23rd July. In topic, we have explored how we develop our physical and character traits through inherited and environmental factors. In PSHE, we have watched videos and discussed the areas covered to support our learning.
