### **Value of the Month**

The value of the month for October is Friendship. During assemblies and class discussion times we will be exploring questions linked to friends and friendships:

- What would you put in your 'friendship soup'?
- What could you do to be a better friend?
- How can you rescue a friendship that has hit a rocky patch?
- Who are our neighbours?

Our inspirational person this month is Mother Theresa. The children will be finding out about her life and achievements and what we can learn from these.

During October we will also be celebrating Black History Month and the children will be researching the achievements of black astronauts and scientists.

### **News from the classes this week:**

#### **Foundation Stage**

This is the first week that we have all stayed all day. We have coped with it very well and are learning the school routines and expectations.

This week we heard the story of the Little Red Hen, and how she had to make bread all by herself because none of her friends would help her. We decided to make bread, like the Little Red Hen, but unlike the story, we all helped make the bread and worked as a team, so we all got to eat the bread, too! It was delicious. We have also been ordering the story, using pictures to prompt us. We have started phonics and have learnt the sounds s, a, t and p. We are using these sounds to start to build words. In number time we have been learning to recognise and write our numbers.

#### **Year One**

This week in English we have been thinking about pets! We had an exciting visitor on Tuesday; Penny from the Blue Cross. She talked to us about what pets need to be happy and healthy. We have written sentences about pets and made a poster so that we could share information about the pets that we have or the pets we would like.

It has been a busy addition week in Maths. We have been adding up using cubes, pictures and even a number line! We have talked a lot about the importance of being accurate.

Our topic this term is Family and Friends. We have been looking at the differences between ourselves and the family of Peter Rabbit. We have also been trying to perfect our mouse control skills in ICT!

## **Year Two**

In Year 2 we have been enjoying the story of 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. We have been helping George to learn how to write instructions. Firstly, we read many different recipes and identified their features. Then we practised reading and following instructions to make jelly and our grape caterpillars. We then sequenced a set of instructions which were muddled! At the end of the week, we spent time exploring appropriate ingredients for a marvellous medicine and developed our vocabulary to describe the ingredients.

In Phonics, we have been learning the 4 different rules for adding suffixes to root words: just add the suffix, double the consonant, drop the 'e' and change the y to an i.

In Maths we have learned how to represent 2-digit numbers in different ways e.g. using base 10, straw bundles, ten frames and place value counters. We have been revising the value of the tens digit, so that we understand the 2 in 25 equals 2 tens and not 20 tens!

In Topic we have been practising our Harvest poem and exploring the story of The Great Fire of London through Music and Drama.

Have a go at following a recipe at home. I would love to see a picture of your food!

## **Year Three**

This week in English, we have started learning from our new text 'The True Story of The Three Little Pigs'. We have written recounts from different perspectives as well as hot seating. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting mentally using multiples of 10, 100 and 1000. We have also answered related word problems. In PE, we have started learning Jive for indoor PE. In art we have been looking at how artists can use colours to express different emotions. We looked at works by the abstract artist Mark Rothko and created our own emotion pictures using watercolours. In History we have continued to learn about the Roman Emperors Julius Caesar and Claudius. We discovered how Caesar was unable to conquer Britain but Claudius was successful and rode through Colchester on a horse to celebrate! In Science we have been learning how fossils are formed.

## **Year Four**

During our English lessons this week, we have continued to read 'The Spiderwick Chronicles'. In the story, Jared discovered a riddle which he had to solve in order to find a mysterious book. We had great fun writing our own riddles for Jared to solve! We have also read about the creature that is causing mischief in the Spiderwick house, and have begun writing information reports about this creature.

In our maths lessons, we have looked at ordering and comparing four-digit numbers. We have used place value counters to discover which column we should look at first when ordering numbers, before ordering these numbers in ascending and descending order. We have also begun to look at negative numbers.

During our topic lessons, we have begun looking at the tropical rainforests of the world. We have found out the location of these rainforests in relation to the equator and named the continents in which they can be found. We have looked at the different layers of the rainforest and what conditions are like here.

## **Year Five**

In Maths this week we have practised counting forwards and backwards in whole numbers through zero, and been introduced to negative numbers. After placing negative numbers correctly on a timeline we progressed to solving problems involving thermometer scales. We had fun unwrapping our class novel, 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo, and read the first two chapters. We developed an understanding of one of the main characters by writing a recount of their day in the first person. In Topic we published our non-chronological reports about aspects of life in Britain during WWII. We were introduced to Gracie Fields' marching song 'Wish me luck' and thought about who would have sung this, where they might have been and who may have joined in. We

practised our Spanish harvest poem and are getting to grips with some key pronunciation rules.

## Year Six

In English we have continued our unit of work based on Roald Dahl's autobiographical book, 'Boy – Tales of a Childhood'. We have read about Mrs Pratchett, the horrible owner of the sweet shop in Llandaff, which Roald Dahl used to spend his pocket money in. We have then written character descriptions of Mrs Pratchett. We have also read the chapter where Roald Dahl and his friends find a dead mouse and they place it in the Gobstopper jar to get their revenge on Mrs Pratchett. We have written our own versions of 'The Great Mouse Plot' from the point of view of Mrs Pratchett or Thwaites, Roald Dahl's friend. In Maths we have been rounding any whole number and decimal number to a required degree of accuracy, comparing and ordering fractions and simplifying fractions. In Topic we have continued our exploration of the circulatory system and have started an investigation into the impact of exercise on our heart rates.

**Update**

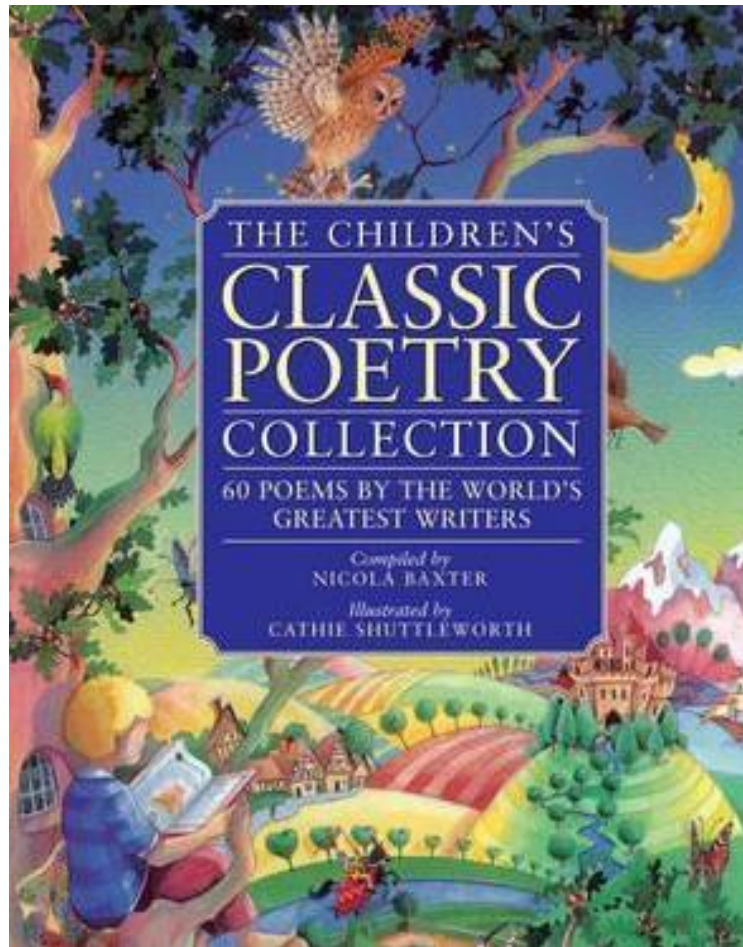

## How to use AmazonSmile on your ~~android~~ iPhone / IOS

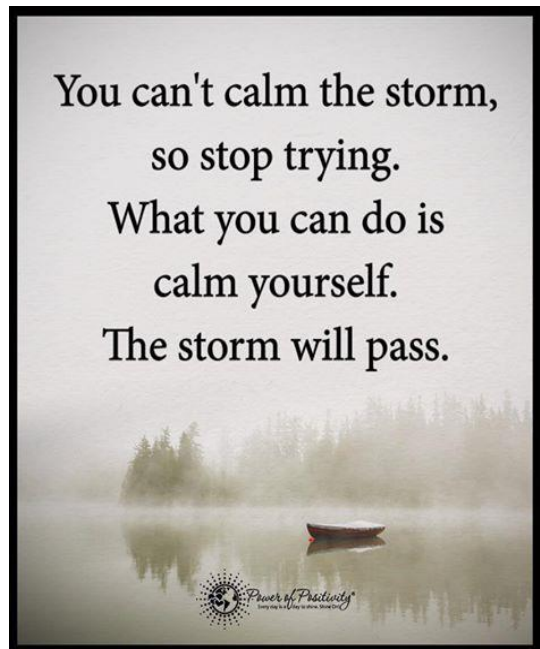
