News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have been visited by fairies! We have learnt about the Cottingley Fairies and have designed and made fairies ourselves. We have also had some fairy visitors as we have found little sprinkles of fairy dust around the class room. We have used cubes to weigh fairies and have been surprised to find that some of the smaller fairies were heavier than the larger ones. We have also enjoyed the story of the three little pigs. We have been acting out the story in our role play area and testing out building houses from straw, sticks and bricks.

This is an *adult* website which will explain what we have learnt about the Cottingley Fairies. You could ask your child to tell you about the pictures, or share some of the text with them. They wouldn't be expected to use it by themselves.

Year One

In English this week we have been introduced to our new class author Mick Inkpen. We have enjoyed learning about one of his most popular books, "Jasper's beanstalk". We worked in pairs to sequence the story. We have also written super sentences to retell the story and have used some great adjectives to make some of the story sentences even better. Year 1 has also been very clever by learning all about making a word into a plural by adding s. In Maths it has been a busy week learning about time! Year 1 loved listening to the story 'What's the time Mr Wolf' by Debbie Gliori. We used analogue clocks to make the o'clock time in the story. Then we matched o'clock times to a selection of clocks and moved on to learning how to read and make half past times.

In Topic this week we have been introduced to our new topic; "Greenfingers". We have been labelling parts of a flowering plant. We also observed the trees around school; chose one of these to draw and labelled it with the words trunk, branch, roots and twigs. We learnt that we can identify different trees by the shape of their leaves and sorted a selection of leaves from deciduous trees.

Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been enjoying the start of a Fairy Tales unit in English. Our text is "Jack and the Beanstalk" by Richard Walker. Using the text, we have explored the structure and features of a Fairy Tale story and described the setting and the character of the Giant. We have been learning how to select appropriate adjectives and developing our ability to write noun-phrases. In Phonics, we have been learning how to read and write

words with the suffix -ly. We have used these words to help us to write sentences beginning with adverbs such as: quickly, secretly and wildly. In Maths, we have been exploring number bonds for 100, looking at patterns. We have also represented these number bonds using the coins 10p, 20p and 50p. In Topic, we have begun our new topic "We Are What We Eat". We have begun this topic with an Art focus, looking at the work of Giuseppe Arcimboldo. We also developed our observational skills by sketching real fruits and vegetables.

Year Three

Welcome back to Year Three! In English this week we started our new text, 'Storm', written by Kevin Crossley-Holland. We have explored imaginative description, which had the class stepping into the shoes of the main character, Annie. The class wrote about various locations in the book using descriptive writing. Towards the end of the week, we wrote various character descriptions, showing the similarities and differences between the characters. In Maths, we have been working on various adding and subtracting strategies. Specifically, we have focused on adding/subtracting 10, 50, and 100. We have used 'money' as a tool to help us understand these concepts. Towards the end of the week, we worked on word problems that involve adding and subtracting numbers into the hundreds. This week in Topic, we have started our new unit "Gateways to the World". We have shown our knowledge of airports and other countries through discussion, drama, and various forms of writing. We have also learned about African style dancing in P.E.

Year Four

This week in English we have begun reading our new book for this unit, which is called "The Firework-Maker's Daughter". We have drawn imaginative designs for our own fireworks and written about these fireworks using descriptive language. We have also thought about the characters from the story and have written instructions on "How to look after the white elephant". In maths we have had a focus on number and place value. We have been rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 as well as comparing and ordering four-digit numbers using maths symbols. During our topic lessons we have begun our new unit called "Shake It!" We have found out the properties of a solid, liquid and acted out how the particles of these states of matter behave. We have investigated the properties of milk using scientific methods and done our own research into milk before designing a leaflet detailing everything we have discovered about milk so far.

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five has started a new text called "Oranges in No Man's Land" by Elizabeth Laird. As background research for this, we have been writing non-chronological reports on the civil war in Lebanon- and even had a civil war break out in the classroom! We have started looking at the main character, Ayesha, and the key events which happen at the beginning of the story. In maths, Year Five has been exploring place value with six digit numbers. We have been extending our knowledge of rounding, by rounding numbers to the nearest ten thousand and hundred thousand, and have been exploring negative numbers. This has included finding the difference between positive and negative numbers, and using addition and subtraction with negative numbers.

Year Five has started a new topic this week called "The Great, The Bold and The Brave." We will be learning about many aspects of Roman life and society. So far, we have looked at classical buildings and designed their own Roman mosaics.

Year Six

In English this week, we have written boasting poems and have started a new unit based on a film clip called "Eye of the Storm". We have written descriptions of the setting and characters – the mysterious pilot and the dragon. Our grammar focus has been identifying and writing subordinate clauses and our current spelling rule is adding suffixes beginning with a vowel to words ending –fer. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting negative numbers, interpreting line graphs and plotting coordinates across all four quadrants. We have started our new Topic for this half term which is the Ancient Mayans. We have discovered where they lived and have thought been what we already know about them and what we would like to find out. On Thursday evening, those of us who attend the Matrix sessions went to the rescheduled Celebration Evening at Wycombe Wanderers Football Club.
