News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we have been exploring in the woods. We found fairy dust! We have been using adjectives to describe the woods and planning and photographing our fairies. We have printed our photos. We have been finding pairs of numbers that add up to make 10 and noticing that if you swop the two numbers around eg: 8+2 or 2+8 you still get the same answer. We have also been building on the Three Pigs' building site, with straw, sticks and bricks. In phonics we have learnt the sounds oo, ee ai and igh, and have been building words with these sounds.

Year One

This week we have enjoyed reading 'Jasper's Beanstalk'. We worked together to sequence the story and also wrote some super sentences to retell the story. This week we have been busy using adjectives to describe the story characters and also improving our sentences using the words and/because. We have also had a lot of fun following instructions to make our grass-heads! In maths we have had a busy doubling week! We worked in pairs to find the doubles of numbers by rolling 2 dice. Rolling a double proved to be quite a challenge! We also had fun measuring parts of our body and then doubling the number of cubes we needed. We measured our hands, our ears and even our noses! This week in topic we have been checking on our seed investigation. The seeds in the light are growing well and are green. The seeds in the dark are also growing but they are brown. We talked about the reasons for this. We learnt how to make a grass-head and had to make a shopping list for Miss Weston with everything that we will need. www.ictgames.com/robindoubles.html

Year Two

This week, in Year 2, we have been enjoying the story of 'Jack and the beanstalk'. We have created instructions on how to get rid of a giant, we have written a letter to Grandma, as Jack, to tell her about his trip up the beanstalk and we have planned and written our own version of the story with an alternative resolution. In Phonics, we have been learning alternative spellings of the sound j (g, dge and ge). In Maths, we have been making different amounts of money using coins. We have had to use our knowledge of place value to help us! In Topic, we have been learning about the different food groups and how these foods help our bodies to grow healthily. We have also designed our own healthy meal, making sure each food group is represented. We learned that foods containing fats and sugar should be eaten as a treat.

Year Three

This week started off with a bang for Year 3! We had the FAB Academy come into Loudwater and teach some rugby lessons. We had a great time! On Monday and Tuesday we completed English and Maths assessments which they did brilliantly. In English, we worked on creating a map of Waterslain (the town in our novel 'Storm'), we also have been working on creating instructions and diary entries revolving around' Storm'. In maths, we have been working on place value, with a focus on comparing and ordering numbers. We used place value charts, base ten apparatus, place value counters, and many other resources to show our understanding of place value. On Friday we had a parent come in to talk with the children about airports, and how they operate as well as how the airplanes work. Year Four

In our English lessons we have continued to read the book 'The Firework-maker's daughter'. We have written a letter from the perspective of Lalchand back to Lila, in response to her note about leaving home. We have acted out a conversation between those two characters and written dialogue between them, remembering to punctuate in the correct places. In our Maths lessons, we have been learning Roman numerals up to 100. We have learnt how to read and write Roman numerals and converted the numbers we use today into Roman numerals. We have also learnt how the number system developed into the number system that we use today. In our topic lessons we have completed an investigation into melting points of different liquids that we had frozen. We had predicted which one we thought would melt first, before carrying out the investigation and presenting our results in a bar chart.

Year Five

This week in English, Year Five has been continuing to read Oranges in No Man's Land. We have written diary entries and letters as Ayesha to explain the events going on around her and have started to use drama to explore some of the key scenes. In maths, Year Five has been continuing to explore negative numbers, focusing on solving worded problems. We have also looked at the Roman number system and have been practising their Roman numerals to 1000. In topic lessons. Year Five has been learning about the hierarchy of Roman society, and about how unpleasant it would be to be a slave! We have also designed and made paper mosaics, which look fantastic.

Year Six

In English this week, we have continued to use the 'Eye of the Storm' film as our stimulus for writing sentences using a semi-colon. We have also written a short flashback scene to give the reader more information about the mysterious pilot. Our grammar focus has been writing subordinate clauses and our current spelling focus is words ending with -able and ably. In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on negative numbers and numbers with 2 and 3 decimal places. In Topic we have been examining pictures of Ancient Mayan artefacts, thinking about what they are made from and what they are used for. On Thursday we enjoyed performing our class assembly and the rest of the school.
