News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Foundation Stage this week we are really proud of how well we have managed, now that we are all attending school full time. We have really enjoyed the story of "Handa's Surprise", and have tried to remember the names of all the animals in the story, and all the different types of fruit that they took from Handa's basket. As we hadn't tasted some of the fruits, we had a tasting session, where we tried mango, avocado, pineapple, oranges, tangerines and bananas. The favourites were banana, orange and mango. Only 6 of us liked the avocado!

In phonics we have learnt the first four sounds -s, a, t and p, and we are excited to be taking home our first sound book to share with everyone at home.

In maths we have been matching and sorting buttons. We found that you sort buttons in many different ways, such as by size, colour, shape, or by the number of holes they have. We have also been practising our counting and singing number songs.

We have used our new sketchbooks to draw self- portraits, and have talked about healthy eating, and how important it is to eat plenty of fruit and vegetables.

Year One

'Where the wild things are' has been our focus text for this week and will be for the next two weeks. This week we have been focussing on Max, the main character. We used lots of words to describe him and used some of these in our very own sentences. We all tried very hard. We also learnt what is meant by a story setting and we used the watercolour paints to create our own setting for the story. We all loved doing this. (If you need any ideas for Christmas presents for your children watercolour paints would be a good choice!)

In Maths we have worked very hard on matching objects and comparing the amount of objects in a set. We have been using vocabulary such as more and less than, greater and fewer than and equals. We have also been practicing reading and writing our numbers in numerals and in words. A great thing to practice at home too.

We started our Geography lesson this week by reading 'Lost and Found'. We worked out that this story is set in Antarctica. We went for a walk around the school grounds and thought of ways that Loudwater is different to Antarctica. We had some great ideas. We also thought about the weather in Antarctica, not a place we would like to live! If you would like to find out

more about Antarctic you can watch this clip which is a trailer for the BBC programme 'Seven Continents, One Planet. Well worth a watch but just beware of the sad parts in the complete episode.

Year Two

This week, in English, we have taken inspiration from the story of 'George's Marvellous Medicine' to learn about instructions. We have read a variety of instructions, noticing the features and creating an 'Instructions Toolkit'. We have followed instructions to make jelly and an origami fox and sequenced instructions that had been mixed up. We then sorted ingredients for a marvellous medicine, describing those using adjectives. We used these ideas to write a list poem about ingredients for a marvellous medicine for Grandma. In Guided Reading, we have begun reading the story 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey. We have made predictions and wonderings, retrieved answers to questions and used vocabulary from the text to visualise the setting. In Phonics, we have begun learning the rules for writing past tense verbs. We have explored when to add the suffix - ed, when to double the consonant, when to drop the e and when to change the y to an i. We will be revisiting this learning throughout Year 2 but it would also be very helpful to revisit these rules at home (see class page for spelling rules). In Maths, we have been using our place value knowledge to build numbers using tens and ones (see website link below). We have used this knowledge to solve problems and calculate totals. We have also been focusing on number bonds to 20. By Year 2, most children should recall number bonds to 20 by heart. This is also a very useful skill to practise at home. In Geography, we have explored physical and human features of the seaside. We have labelled pictures and sorted features. In Computing, we are using Paint to explore the different tools and to create pictures. This week we created a picture of Grandma from George's Marvellous Medicine. In PE, we have used mats, benches and hoops to explore travelling in different ways and balancing with control. We also had our first visit to the school library on Wednesday. The library books can be enjoyed at home but need to be back in school on Wednesday so a new book can be chosen.

Year Three


This week in English, we have been role playing and answering questions through hot-seating. We have written questions and answered them from a character's perspective. We have learnt about word classes and have learnt how to identify nouns, verbs and adjectives. We have also participated in a class debate and given explanations for our decisions.

In Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We have learnt how to add and subtract multiples of 100 and 1s. We have also learnt how to add and subtract 3-digit numbers and 1-digit numbers- not crossing 10. We have also learnt how to add numbers - crossing 10.

In Geography, we have been learning about North and South America. We have learnt about some of the countries and their climates. In RE, we have learnt about why art is used in religions. In Computing, we have continued learning about online safety and learnt about cyber security.

Year Four

We have continued our work with the story 'Augustus and His Smile' in our English lessons this week. We have been writing a narrative for the story using descriptive words and phrases. We have plotted the tiger's journey across the lands in search of his smile. In our reading lessons, we have been reading Bill's New Frock, and practising the skill of inference by using clues in the text.

During our Maths lessons this week, we have been comparing and ordering four digit numbers. We have learned how to round four digit numbers to the nearest 1000 by thinking about their position on a number line. We have learnt how to count in multiples of 25, and learnt how to count backwards through zero to go into negative numbers.

In our Geography lessons, we have learnt about the different features of mountains such as the summit, ridge and face. We have also learned about the main types of mountains and how these are formed. In our PSHE lessons, we have thought about personal goals that we can set ourselves for now and for the future. In our PE lesson, we learned the technique of shooting in handball and played small sided games.

Year Five

In English lessons this week, we continued to read 'Friend or Foe' and explored the character of Mr. Reynolds, the friendly Devon farmer who has taken in two evacuees. We also used expanded noun phrases and other figurative, interesting word choices to describe Ann's cosy farmhouse kitchen.

In Maths we have moved on to our Addition and Subtraction unit and have revised using place value counters and grids to add two 4-digit numbers before progressing to the abstract column method for numbers up to 5-digits. We are trying hard to check our calculations as, whilst Mrs PC is confident our column method is sound, we are sometimes making basic errors when adding two single digits together vertically. She has challenged us to practise this whenever we can and has invited us to come up with ideas we could share.

In RE lessons this week, we have furthered our knowledge of rites of passage by discussing marriage and learning more about a Christian marriage ceremony.

In spelling lessons, we have finished our spelling bee and revision of Y3 and Y4 words. Congratulations go to Team Talk and Team MacDonald's who drew in the final, scoring 14/15 each. Both had spelled *exercise* incorrectly but now we all know to check this word carefully! In Guided Reading lessons we have explored a mother's diary extract written after her children had been evacuated to the countryside from London. We learnt of her pain of being separated from them but also of her additional responsibilities to the war effort as a busy machinist making uniforms. In Geography, we have been using atlases to find capital cities, countries and continents. We have also practised identifying oceans and rivers and used the four cardinal and four intercardinal points of the compass to help us.

Year Six

In English we have started a new unit of work using 'Boy - Tales of Childhood' by Roald Dahl as our inspiration. We have read the chapter The Bicycle and the Sweet Shop and discover how the sweet shop in Llandaff (where Dahl lived as a child) was the centre of his world. We have used the story about how liquorice bootlaces were made from rat's blood to write our own sweet stories. We have also found out about the vile Mrs Pratchett, the owner of the sweet shop. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting whole numbers with more than 4 digits, using the inverse operation to check our answers and solving addition and subtraction multi-step problems.

In Geography, we used our knowledge of the 8 compass points to navigate around a course. In PSHE, we have continued to discuss mental health and how we can manage challenges and change, thinking about strategies to support us and the people in our support network. In Art, we have begun to explore what a collage is. This week, we have been enjoying the music of Ladysmith Black Mambazo.

Working with Chiltern Rangers

On Tuesday Chiltern Rangers will be in school and Years 1 - 6 will have the opportunity to work outside with the Ranger and school staff to maintain and tidy areas of the school grounds and the small section of Fennels Wood that we have access to.

For these activities the children need to wear suitable clothing and footwear; things which can get dirty and trainers which are not their PE shoes.

Year 6 and Year 3 should come to school wearing their outdoor clothes and bring their uniforms to change into.

Other classes should come to school in their outdoor clothes and should not need to change as they are working outside during the afternoon.

Year 4 should bring their PE trainers with them as they will be doing PE after their outdoor session.

Breakfast Club & L8R

Thank you for your patience whilst the clubs have been undergoing updating and maintenance. The club listing will once again be closed this evening, for a short time, to undergo the final update. Once reopened all classes will show in one group for Breakfast and one for the L8R After School Club. The numbers will be limited to 30 and places must be booked one week in advance as usual. We understand that emergencies happen and office staff are able to make late bookings if required but only if the numbers are low enough to accommodate and not as a regular occurrence as we do need to know numbers early enough to plan our staffing levels. There is now a new feature, clubs sessions no longer required may be cancelled by yourselves up to 24 hours before. If a child misses a booked session for any reason other than illness you will still be charged.
